In addition, the member's primary duties and 172 173 responsibilities must include piloting or copiloting, often at low altitudes, a rotary-wing or fixed-wing aircraft for chemical 174 175 application of pesticides for controlling mosquitoes or other 176 arthropods.

177 Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees 178 179 of the state and its political subdivisions, and the dependents, 180 survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and retirees, are 181 extended the basic protections afforded by governmental retirement systems. These persons must be provided benefits that 182 are fair and adequate and that are managed, administered, and 183 184 funded in a sound actuarial manner, as required by Section 14, 185 Article X of the State Constitution and part VII of chapter 112, 186 Florida Statutes. Therefore, the Legislature hereby determines 187 and declares that this act fulfills an important state interest. 188 Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2006.
