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CS 23 Section 1. Section 401.2915, Florida Statutes, is amended 24 to read: Automated external defibrillators.--It is the 25 401.2915 26 intent of the Legislature that an automated external defibrillator may be used by any person for the purpose of 27 28 saving the life of another person in cardiac arrest. In order to achieve that goal, the Legislature intends to encourage training 29 in lifesaving first aid and set standards for and encourage the 30 use of automated external defibrillators. 31 As used in this section, the term: 32 (1)(a) "Automated external defibrillator" means a device as 33 34 defined in s. 768.1325(2)(b). 35 "Defibrillation" means the administration of a (b) controlled electrical charge to the heart to restore a viable 36 37 cardiac rhythm. In order to ensure public health and safety: 38 (2) 39 (a) (1) All persons who use an automated external defibrillator must obtain appropriate training, to include 40 41 completion of a course in cardiopulmonary resuscitation or successful completion of a basic first aid course that includes 42 43 cardiopulmonary resuscitation training, and demonstrated 44 proficiency in the use of an automated external defibrillator. 45 (b) (2) Any person or entity in possession of an automated external defibrillator is encouraged to register with the local 46 emergency medical services medical director the existence and 47 location of the automated external defibrillator. 48 (c) (3) Any person who uses an automated external 49 50 defibrillator shall activate the emergency medical services Page 2 of 3

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51	system as soon as possible upon use of the automated external

53	(3) Any person who intentionally or willfully:
54	(a) Tampers with or otherwise renders an automated
55	external defibrillator inoperative, except during such time as
56	the automated external defibrillator is being serviced, tested,
57	repaired, recharged, or inspected or except pursuant to court
58	order; or
59	(b) Obliterates the serial number on an automated external
60	defibrillator for purposes of falsifying service records,

62	commits a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as
63	provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083. Paragraph (a) does not
64	apply to the owner of the automated external defibrillator or
65	the owner's authorized representative or agent.
66	(4) Each local and state law enforcement vehicle may carry
67	an automated external defibrillator.
68	Section 2. The Department of Health shall implement an
69	educational campaign to inform any person who acquires an
70	automated external defibrillator device of the scope and
71	limitations of the immunity from liability provided under s.
72	768.1325, Florida Statutes.
73	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2006.

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
