The nature and intensity of 5 the services indicated on the matrix shall be consistent with 6 7 the services described in each exceptional student's individual educational plan. 8

In order to generate funds using one of the two 10 weighted cost factors, a matrix of services must be completed 11 at the time of the student's initial placement into an exceptional student education program and at least once every 12 13 3 years by personnel who have received approved training.
