20	race, color, ancestry, ethnicity, religion, sexual orientation,
21	national origin, <u>homeless status,</u> mental or physical disability,
22	or advanced age of the victim:
23	1. A misdemeanor of the second degree is reclassified to a
24	misdemeanor of the first degree.

26	felony of the third degree.
27	3. A felony of the third degree is reclassified to a

Restitution and 54 community service work shall be in addition to any fine or 55 sentence that may be imposed and shall not be in lieu thereof. 56
