Section 1. Section 381.84, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

The department shall expand the existing AHEC smoking cessation initiative to each county in the state where appropriated funds may be used to improve the infrastructure 5 of the county health department to implement the 7 comprehensive, statewide tobacco education and prevention program. This program must include the following components, 8 9 each of which must focus on educating people, particularly youth and their parents, about the health hazards of tobacco 10 11 and discouraging the use of tobacco: (a) An advertising campaign, including 12 counter-marketing, must consist of, but need not be limited 13 14 to, television, radio, the Internet, and print advertising, which is funded with a minimum of one-third of each total 15 annual appropriation required by s. 27, Art.
