1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to the Century Commission for a 3 Sustainable Florida; amending s. 163.3247, F.S.; increasing the membership of the commission; revising 4 provisions governing appointments to the commission by the 5 6 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 7 the House of Representatives; prohibiting a member of the 8 commission from having certain interests in contracts or 9 benefits awarded by the commission; providing for additional powers and duties of the commission; revising 10 provisions concerning appointment and oversight of the 11 executive director of the commission; transferring the 12 commission to the Office of Legislative Services for 13 administrative purposes; providing an effective date. 14 15 16 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 17 Subsections (3), (4), and (5) of section 18 Section 1. 19 163.3247, Florida Statutes, are amended to read: Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida. --20 163.3247 CENTURY COMMISSION FOR A SUSTAINABLE FLORIDA; 21 (3) CREATION; ORGANIZATION. -- The Century Commission for a 22 Sustainable Florida is created as a standing body to help the 23 24 citizens of this state envision and plan their collective future 25 with an eye towards both 25-year and 50-year horizons. 26 (a) The commission shall consist of 18 <del>15</del> members, 6 <del>5</del> appointed by the Governor, 6-5 appointed by the President of the 27 Senate, and 6 5 appointed by the Speaker of the House of 28 Page 1 of 6

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Representatives. Appointments shall be made no later than 29 30 October 1, 2005. The membership must represent local governments, school boards, developers and homebuilders, the 31 business community, the agriculture community, the environmental 32 community, and other appropriate stakeholders. In making the 33 appointments, the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the 34 35 Speaker of the House of Representatives shall ensure that the membership of the commission reflects the racial, ethnic, and 36 37 gender diversity, as well as the geographic distribution, of the state's population. One member shall be designated by the 38 Governor as chair of the commission. Any vacancy that occurs on 39 the commission must be filled in the same manner as the original 40 appointment and shall be for the unexpired term of that 41 commission seat. Members shall be appointed to serve 4-year 42 terms, except that, initially, to provide for staggered terms, 43 44 the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of 45 the House of Representatives shall each appoint one member to 46 serve a 2 year term, two members to serve 3 year terms, and two 47 members to serve 4-year terms. All subsequent appointments shall 48 <del>be for 4 year terms.</del> An appointee may not serve more than 8 <del>6</del> 49 years.

50 (b) The first meeting of the commission shall be held no 51 later than December 1, 2005, and shall meet at the call of the 52 chair but not less frequently than three times per year in 53 different regions of the state to solicit input from the public 54 or any other individuals offering testimony relevant to the 55 issues to be considered.

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(c) Each member of the commission is entitled to one vote, Page 2 of 6

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and actions of the commission are not binding unless taken by a three-fifths vote of the members present. A majority of the members is required to constitute a quorum, and the affirmative vote of a quorum is required for a binding vote.

(d) Members of the commission shall serve without
compensation but <u>are shall be</u> entitled to receive per diem and
travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061 while in
performance of their duties.

(e) A member of the commission may not, in the period
commencing with his or her appointment to the commission and
continuing for 2 years after termination of such appointment,
have an interest, direct or indirect, in any contract or other
benefit granted or awarded by the commission.

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(4) POWERS AND DUTIES.--The commission shall:

(a) Annually Conduct a process through which the commission envisions the future for the state and then develops and recommends policies, plans, action steps, or strategies to assist in achieving the vision.

(b) Continuously review and consider statutory and regulatory provisions, governmental processes, and societal and economic trends in its inquiry of how state, regional, and local governments and entities and citizens of this state can best accommodate projected increased populations while maintaining the natural, historical, cultural, and manmade life qualities that best represent the state.

(c) Bring together people representing varied interests to
develop a shared image of the state and its developed and
natural areas. The process should involve exploring the impact

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of the estimated population increase and other emerging trends and issues; creating a vision for the future; and developing a strategic action plan to achieve that vision using 25-year and 50-year intermediate planning timeframes.

(d) Focus on essential state interests, defined as those interests that transcend local or regional boundaries and are most appropriately conserved, protected, and promoted at the state level.

93 (e) Serve as an objective, nonpartisan repository of
94 exemplary community-building ideas and as a source to recommend
95 strategies and practices to assist others in working
96 collaboratively to problem solve on issues relating to growth
97 management.

(f) Annually, on beginning January 16, 2007, and every 98 99 year thereafter on the same date, provide to the Governor, the 100 President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives a written report containing specific 101 recommendations for addressing growth management in the state, 102 103 including executive and legislative recommendations. Further, the report must shall contain discussions regarding the need for 104 105 intergovernmental cooperation and the balancing of environmental 106 protection and future development and recommendations on issues, including, but not limited to, recommendations regarding 107 dedicated sources of funding for sewer facilities, water supply 108 and quality, transportation facilities that are not adequately 109 addressed by the Strategic Intermodal System, and educational 110 infrastructure to support existing development and projected 111 population growth. 112

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113	(g) Create and dissolve advisory committees or similar
114	organizations as necessary in order to carry out the mission of
115	the commission.
116	(h) Enter into contracts to receive and accept grants and
117	contributions from any source, which shall be used to further
118	the mission of the commission.
119	(i) Prepare and submit a budget under chapter 216.

122	Beginning with the 2007 Regular Session of the Legislature, the
123	President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
124	Representatives shall create a joint select committee, the task
125	of which shall be to review the findings and recommendations of
126	the Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida for potential
127	action.
128	(5) EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR; STAFF AND OTHER ASSISTANCE
129	(a) The commission shall appoint an executive director who
130	shall serve under the direction, supervision, and control of the
131	commission. The commission shall have complete authority for
132	fixing the salary of the executive director. The commission is
133	assigned to the Office of Legislative Services for purposes of
134	administration and fiscal accountability, but the commission
135	shall otherwise function independently. The executive director,
136	with the consent of the commission and within budgetary
137	limitations, shall employ staff as necessary to adequately
138	perform the functions of the commission. The Secretary of
139	Community Affairs shall select an executive director of the
140	commission, and the executive director shall serve at the
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141 pleasure of the secretary under the supervision and control of
142 the commission.

(b) The <u>Office of Legislative Services</u> <del>Department of</del>
Community Affairs</del> shall provide staff and other resources
necessary to accomplish the goals of the commission based upon
recommendations of the Legislature <del>Covernor</del>.

147 (c) All agencies under the control of the Governor are
148 directed, and all other agencies are requested, to render
149 assistance to, and cooperate with, the commission.

Section 2. <u>The three additional appointments to the</u>
<u>Century Commission for a Sustainable Florida required by section</u>
<u>1 of this act shall be made by October 1, 2007.</u>

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.

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
