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| 18 | Section 1. Section 627.42395, Florida Statutes, is             |

- (b) Amino-acid-based elemental formulas, regardless of the method of intake, for the medically necessary treatment of medically diagnosed conditions such as severe multiple allergies, gastroesophageal reflux, and eosinophilic disorders when ordered by a licensed physician.
- (2) This section applies to any person or family notwithstanding the existence of any preexisting condition.
- Section 2. Sections 2 through 4 of this act may be cited as the "Mary B. Hooks Act."
- Section 3. Subsections (1) and (2) and paragraph (a) of subsection (4) of section 627.64171, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
- 627.64171 Coverage for length of stay and outpatient postsurgical care. --
- (1) Any health insurance policy that is issued, amended, delivered, or renewed in this state which provides coverage for breast cancer treatment may not limit inpatient hospital coverage for <a href="https://www.node.gip.node. to any period that is less than that determined by the treating physician to be medically necessary in accordance with prevailing medical standards and after consultation with the insured patient.
- (2) Any health insurance policy that provides coverage

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(1) must also provide coverage for outpatient postsurgical followup care in keeping with prevailing medical standards by a licensed health care professional qualified to provide postsurgical lymph node dissection or mastectomy care. The treating physician, after consultation with the insured patient, may choose that the outpatient care be provided at the most medically appropriate setting, which may include the hospital, treating physician's office, outpatient center, or home of the insured patient.

(4)(a) This section does not require an insured patient to have a lymph node dissection or the mastectomy in the hospital or stay in the hospital for a fixed period of time following the lymph node dissection or mastectomy.

Section 4. Subsections (1) and (2) and paragraph (a) of subsection (4) of section 627.66121, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

627.66121 Coverage for length of stay and outpatient postsurgical care. --

- (1) Any group, blanket, or franchise accident or health insurance policy that is issued, amended, delivered, or renewed in this state which provides coverage for breast cancer treatment may not limit inpatient hospital coverage for lymph node dissections or mastectomies to any period that is less than that determined by the treating physician to be medically necessary in accordance with prevailing medical standards and after consultation with the insured patient.
- (2) Any group, blanket, or franchise accident or health insurance policy that provides coverage for lymph node dissections or mastectomies under subsection (1) must also provide coverage for outpatient postsurgical followup care in 31 keeping with prevailing medical standards by a licensed health

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care professional qualified to provide postsurgical <u>lymph node</u> <u>dissection or</u> mastectomy care. The treating physician, after consultation with the insured patient, may choose that the outpatient care be provided at the most medically appropriate setting, which may include the hospital, treating physician's office, outpatient center, or home of the insured patient.

(4)(a) This section does not require an insured patient to have <u>a lymph node dissection or the</u> mastectomy in the hospital or stay in the hospital for a fixed period of time following the <u>lymph node dissection or mastectomy</u>.

Section 5. Paragraphs (a) and (c) of subsection (31) of section 641.31, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

641.31 Health maintenance contracts.--

(31)(a) Health maintenance contracts that provide coverage, benefits, or services for breast cancer treatment may not limit inpatient hospital coverage for <a href="https://www.notenance.coverage">lymph node</a> dissections or mastectomies to any period that is less than that determined by the treating physician under contract with the health maintenance organization to be medically necessary in accordance with prevailing medical standards and after consultation with the covered patient. Such contract must also provide coverage for outpatient postsurgical followup care in keeping with prevailing medical standards by a licensed health care professional under contract with the health maintenance organization qualified to provide postsurgical lymph node dissection or mastectomy care. The treating physician under contract with the health maintenance organization, after consultation with the covered patient, may choose that the outpatient care be provided at the most medically appropriate setting, which may include the hospital, treating physician's office, outpatient center, or home of the covered patient.

(c)1. This subsection does not require a covered patient to have a lymph node dissection or the mastectomy in the hospital or stay in the hospital for a fixed period of 2. This subsection does not prevent a contract from imposing deductibles, coinsurance, or other cost sharing in relation to benefits pursuant to this subsection, except that such cost sharing shall not exceed cost sharing with other benefits. Section 6. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
