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29 "Credit memo" means a certificate, card, stored value (a) 30 card, or similar instrument issued in exchange for returned merchandise when the certificate, card, or similar instrument is 31 32 redeemable for merchandise, food, or services regardless of 33 whether any cash may be paid to the owner of the certificate, card, or instrument as part of the redemption transaction. 34 35 (b) "Gift certificate" means a certificate, gift card, 36 stored value card, or similar instrument issued in exchange for 37 monetary consideration when the certificate, card, or similar instrument is redeemable for merchandise, food, or services 38 regardless of whether any cash may be paid to the owner of the 39 certificate, card, or instrument as part of the redemption 40 41 transaction. 42 Notwithstanding s. 717.117, an unredeemed gift (3) 43 certificate or credit memo is not required to be reported as 44 unclaimed property.
