The head of the Department of Health is the Florida 68 (2) (a) Surgeon General Secretary of Health and State Health Officer. 69 70 The surgeon general secretary must be a physician licensed under 71 chapter 458 or chapter 459 who has advanced training or 72 extensive experience in public health administration. The 73 surgeon general secretary is appointed by the Governor subject 74 to confirmation by the Senate. The surgeon general secretary 75 serves at the pleasure of the Governor.

(b) The Officer of Women's Health Strategy is established
within the Department of Health and shall report directly to the
surgeon general secretary.

(5) The department shall plan and administer its public health programs through its county health departments and may, for administrative purposes and efficient service delivery, establish up to 15 service areas to carry out such duties as may be prescribed by the <u>surgeon general</u> secretary. 89 The surgeon general secretary and division directors (6) 90 are authorized to appoint ad hoc advisory committees as 91 necessary. The issue or problem that the ad hoc committee shall 92 address, and the timeframe within which the committee is to 93 complete its work, shall be specified at the time the committee is appointed. Ad hoc advisory committees shall include 94 representatives of groups or entities affected by the issue or 95 problem that the committee is asked to examine. Members of ad 96 97 hoc advisory committees shall receive no compensation, but may, 98 within existing departmental resources, receive reimbursement 99 for travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061.
