The department shall serve as the administrative agent of the commission by providing services, including payroll, 21 procurement, and legal counsel. The commission shall be a 22 separate budget entity not subject to control, supervision, or 23 24 direction by the department in any manner, including, but not limited to, personnel, purchasing, transactions involving real 25 or personal property, and budgetary matters, thereby exercising 26 exercise independently all powers, duties, and functions 27 prescribed by law. 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29 of diplomas and degrees by any independent postsecondary 30 educational institution under its jurisdiction. The Commission for Independent Education shall consist 31 (2)32 of nine seven members who are residents of this state. The Governor shall appoint the members of the 37 commission who are subject to confirmation by the Senate. The membership of the commission shall consist of: 38 39 (a) Two members who are either owners or employees representatives of independent colleges or universities licensed 40 by the commission. 41 (b) Two members who are either owners or employees 42 43 representatives of independent, nondegree-granting schools 44 licensed by the commission. (c) One member who is either an owner or employee of an 45 independent, nonaccredited school licensed by the commission. 46 47 (d) Two members who are either owners or employees of independent colleges or schools licensed by the commission. 48 49 (e) (c) One member from a public school district or 50 community college who is an administrator of career education. (d) One representative of a college that meets the 51 criteria of s. 1005.06(1)(f). 52 (f) (e) One lay member who is not affiliated with an 53 independent postsecondary educational institution. 54 The members of the commission shall be appointed to 3-55 (3)year terms and serve until their successors are appointed and 56 Page 2 of 4

If a vacancy on the commission occurs before the 58 expiration of a term, the Governor shall appoint a successor to 59 serve the unexpired portion of the term. 60 The commission shall appoint, review, and fix the (7) salary of a person to serve as the executive director and have 61 sole authority to remove such person at its pleasure. The 62 63 executive director shall supervise, direct, coordinate, and administer all activities necessary to fulfill the commission's 64 65 statutory responsibilities and have the authority to hire staff 66 necessary to assist in fulfilling these responsibilities. 67 Section 2. To this 76 end, the commission has the following administrative powers and 77 responsibilities: 78 The commission shall have the authority to adopt rules 1. 79 pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer the 80 provisions of this chapter for the operation and establishment of independent postsecondary educational institutions. The 81 commission shall submit the rules to the State Board of 82 Education for approval or disapproval. If the state board does 83

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84 not act on a rule within 60 days after receiving it, the rule 85 shall be filed immediately with the Department of State.

86 2. The commission shall submit an annual budget to the87 Governor State Board of Education.

3. The commission shall transmit all fees, donations, and
other receipts of money to the Institutional Assessment Trust
Fund.

The commission shall expend funds as necessary to 91 4. 92 assist in the application and enforcement of its powers and duties. The chief financial officer of the Department of 93 Education Chief Financial Officer shall pay out all moneys and 94 funds as directed under this chapter upon vouchers approved by 95 the executive director of the commission Department of Education 96 97 for all lawful purposes necessary to administering this chapter. 98 The commission shall make annual reports to the President of the 99 Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives State Board of Education showing in detail amounts received and all 100 expenditures. The commission shall include in its annual report 101 102 to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 103 Representatives State Board of Education a statement of its 104 major activities during the period covered by the report.

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(2) The commission may:

(e) Advise the Governor, the Legislature, the State Board
 of Education, the Council for Education Policy Research and
 Improvement, and the Commissioner of Education on issues
 relating to private postsecondary education.

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Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.

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
