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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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           Section 1. Subsections (1), (2), and (8) of section
   1001.64, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
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           1001.64 Community college boards of trustees; powers
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   and duties.--
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           (1) The boards of trustees shall be responsible for
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   cost-effective policy decisions appropriate to the community
   college's mission, the implementation and maintenance of
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   high-quality education programs within law and rules of the
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   State Board of Education, the measurement of performance, the
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   reporting of information, and the provision of input regarding
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    state policy, budgeting, and education standards. Community
   colleges may grant baccalaureate degrees pursuant to s.

   1007.33 and shall remain under the authority of the State
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   Board of Education with respect to planning, coordination,

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           (2) Each board of trustees is vested with the
   responsibility to govern its respective community college and
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   with such necessary authority as is needed for the proper

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           (8) Each board of trustees has authority for policies

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           (a) Each board of trustees shall govern admission of
   students pursuant to s. 1007.263 and rules of the State Board
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1 of Education. A board of trustees may establish additional 2 admissions criteria, which shall be included in the district interinstitutional articulation agreement developed according 3 to s. 1007.235, to ensure student readiness for postsecondary 4 instruction. Each board of trustees may consider the past 5 6 actions of any person applying for admission or enrollment and 7 may deny admission or enrollment to an applicant because of 8 misconduct if determined to be in the best interest of the 9 community college. 10 (b) Each board of trustees shall adopt rules establishing student performance standards for the award of 11 12 degrees and certificates pursuant to s. 1004.68. The board of 13 trustees of a community college which is authorized to grant a baccalaureate degree under s. 1007.33 may continue to award 14 degrees, diplomas, and certificates as authorized for the 15 college, and in the name of the college, until the college 16 17 receives any necessary changes to its accreditation. 18 (c) Each board of trustees shall establish tuition and out-of-state fees for approved baccalaureate degree programs, 19 consistent with law and proviso language in the General 2.0 21 Appropriations Act; however, a board of trustees may not vary 22 tuition and out-of-state fees as provided in s. 1009.23(4). 23 (d) (d) (e) Boards of trustees are authorized to establish intrainstitutional and interinstitutional programs to maximize 2.4 articulation pursuant to s. 1007.22. 25 (e)(d) Boards of trustees shall identify their core 26 27 curricula, which shall include courses required by the State 2.8 Board of Education, pursuant to the provisions of s. 1007.25(6). 29 30 (f) (e) Each board of trustees must adopt a written antihazing policy, provide a program for the enforcement of 31 3

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such rules, and adopt appropriate penalties for violations of 1 2 such rules pursuant to the provisions of s. 1006.63. (q)(f) Each board of trustees may establish a uniform 3 4 code of conduct and appropriate penalties for violation of its rules by students and student organizations, including rules 5 6 governing student academic honesty. Such penalties, unless 7 otherwise provided by law, may include fines, the withholding 8 of diplomas or transcripts pending compliance with rules or 9 payment of fines, and the imposition of probation, suspension, 10 or dismissal. (h) (g) Each board of trustees pursuant to s. 1006.53 11 12 shall adopt a policy in accordance with rules of the State 13 Board of Education that reasonably accommodates the religious observance, practice, and belief of individual students in 14 15 regard to admissions, class attendance, and the scheduling of 16 examinations and work assignments. 17 (i) Each board of trustees shall adopt a policy 18 providing that faculty who teach upper-division courses that are a component part of a baccalaureate degree program must 19 meet the requirements of s. 1012.82. 20 21 Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 1007.33, Florida 22 Statutes, is amended, subsection (4) is renumbered as 23 subsection (6), and new subsections (4) and (5) are added to that section, to read: 2.4 1007.33 Site-determined baccalaureate degree access.--25 (3) A community college may develop a proposal to 26 27 deliver specified baccalaureate degree programs in its 2.8 district to meet local workforce needs. The proposal must be 29 submitted to the State Board of Education for approval. A community college may develop proposals to deliver 30 baccalaureate degree programs in math and science which would 31

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1 prepare graduates to enter a teaching position in math or 2 science or employment in a position that requires a baccalaureate degree in math or science. The community 3 4 college's proposal must include the following information: 5 (a) Demand for the baccalaureate degree program is б identified by the workforce development board, local 7 businesses and industry, local chambers of commerce, and 8 potential students. 9 (b) Unmet need for graduates of the proposed degree program is substantiated. 10 (c) The community college has the facilities and 11 12 academic resources to deliver the program. 13 The proposal must be submitted to the Council for Education 14 15 Policy Research and Improvement for review and comment. Upon approval of the State Board of Education for the specific 16 17 degree program or programs, the community college shall pursue regional accreditation by the Commission on Colleges of the 18 Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Any additional 19 baccalaureate degree programs the community college wishes to 2.0 21 offer must be approved by the State Board of Education. 22 (4) A formal agreement for the delivery of specified 23 baccalaureate degree programs by a regionally accredited public or private college or university at a community college 2.4 site must include: 25 26 (a) A guarantee that students will be able to complete 27 the degree in the community college district. 28 (b) A financial commitment to the development, implementation, and maintenance of the specified degree 29 30 program on behalf of the college or university which includes timelines. 31

1	(c) A plan for collaboration in the development and
2	offering of the curriculum for the specified degree by faculty
3	at both the community college and the college or university.
4	The curriculum for the specified degree must be developed and
5	approved within 6 months after the agreement between the
6	community college and the college or university is signed.
7	(5) A community college proposal to deliver a
8	specified baccalaureate degree program must document that the
9	community college has notified in writing the accredited
10	public and private colleges and universities in the community
11	college's district of its intent to seek approval for delivery
12	of the proposed program. The notified colleges and
13	universities have 90 days to submit in writing to the
14	community college an alternative plan for providing the
15	specified degree program.

24	Requires policies relating to minimum faculty teaching hours per week. Removes a requirement that proposals for a baccalaureate degree program be submitted to the
25	Council for Education Policy Research and Improvement for review and comment. Provides requirements for the
26	delivery of specified baccalaureate degree programs by a regionally accredited college or university at a
