Subsection (8) of section 1009.24, Florida 3 4 Statutes, is amended, and subsection (15) is added to that section, to read: 5 б 1009.24 State university student fees.--7 (8) Each university board of trustees is authorized to establish separate activity and service, health, and athletic 8 fees. When duly established, the fees shall be collected as 9 10 component parts of tuition and fees and shall be retained by 11 the university and paid into the separate activity and service, health, and athletic funds. Notwithstanding any other 12 13 provision of law to the contrary, a university may transfer revenues derived from the fees authorized pursuant to this 14 15 subsection to a university direct-support organization of the university to be used only for the purpose of paying and 16 securing debt on projects approved pursuant to s. 1010.62 and 17 18 pursuant to a written agreement approved by the Board of Governors. The amount transferred may not exceed the amount 19 authorized for annual debt service pursuant to s. 1010.62. 20 21 (15) The Board of Governors may establish a uniform 22 maximum undergraduate tuition differential that does not exceed 40 percent of tuition for all universities that meet 23 2.4 the criteria for Funding Level 1 under s. 1004.635(3), and may establish a uniform maximum undergraduate tuition differential 25 that does not exceed 30 percent of tuition for all 2.6 universities that meet the criteria for Funding Level 2 under 27 s. 1004.635(3).
