The receiver or administrator may bring 2.4 legal actions in the name of and on behalf of the defendant, 25 without regard to any unlawful acts committed by the 26 27 defendant. In addition, the Such receiver or administrator, 28 when appointed and qualified, has shall have all powers and duties as to custody, collection, administration, winding up, 29 and liquidation of the said property and business which are as 30 shall from time to time be conferred upon her or him by the
