33-16A-07 1 Senate Resolution 2 A resolution recognizing the week of April 15-21, 2007, as "Minority Cancer Awareness 3 4 Week" in the State of Florida. 5 б WHEREAS, there has been recent progress in the fight 7 against cancer, yet many Floridians still suffer unequal rates 8 of cancer incidence and mortality, and medically underserved 9 populations have inadequate access to quality cancer prevention, screening, treatment, and rehabilitation services, 10 11 and 12 WHEREAS, certain populations of Floridians, such as African Americans, Hispanics, Latinos, and the medically 13 uninsured, experience higher rates of cancer incidence and 14 death, and 15 16 WHEREAS, even when poverty levels are accounted for, 17 African Americans, American Indians, Asian Americans, and 18 Pacific Islanders have lower 5-year-cancer-survival rates than whites who are not of Hispanic descent, and 19 WHEREAS, among all racial and ethnic groups, African 20 21 Americans experience the highest death rate from all cancers 22 and the highest death rate from lung, colorectal, prostate, 23 and cervical cancers, and 2.4 WHEREAS, Hispanics and Latinos are the fastest-growing 25 segment of the nation's population, and Hispanics are now the largest minority population in Florida, and 26 27 WHEREAS, almost 35 percent of the Hispanic and Latino 2.8 population have no health care coverage and almost 31 percent 29 have no access to regular medical care, making Hispanics and Latinos the most medically underserved population among all 30 racial and ethnic groups, and 31
