A bill to be entitled

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An act relating to solar energy; creating s. 212.0803, F.S.; specifying a limited period each year through 2010, designated Energy Efficient Week, during which the sale of energy-efficient products for noncommercial or personal use is exempt from sales taxation; providing a limitation; providing a definition; prohibiting purchase of products by certain payment methods; providing that certain purchases or attempts to purchase are unfair methods of competition and punishable as such; authorizing the Department of Revenue to adopt rules; amending s. 377.806, F.S.; authorizing only one rebate per installation of certain solar energy systems; providing for preapproved rebates; requiring the Florida Public Service Commission to adopt rules; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to develop preapproval processes by rule; providing legislative findings; requiring the department to establish and publicize an information hotline and create certain promotional materials; providing appropriations; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 212.0803, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

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212.0803 Energy Efficient Week; limited energy-efficient product exemption.--The period from 12:01 a.m., October 5, 2007, through midnight, October 14, 2007, and the period from 12:01

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a.m. on the first Friday of October through midnight on the second Sunday of October for each year thereafter through 2010, shall be designated "Energy Efficient Week," and the tax levied under this chapter may not be collected on the sale of any new energy-efficient product having a selling price of \$1,500 or less per product during that period. This exemption applies only when the energy-efficient product is purchased for noncommercial home or personal use and does not apply when the product is purchased for trade, business, or resale. As used in this section, the term "energy-efficient product" means a dishwasher, clothes washer, clothes dryer, air conditioner, ceiling fan, incandescent or fluorescent light bulb, dehumidifier, programmable thermostat, or refrigerator that has been designated by the United States Environmental Protection Agency or by the United States Department of Energy as meeting or exceeding the requirements under the Energy Star Program of either agency. Purchases made under this section may not be made using a business or company credit or debit card or check. Any construction company, building contractor, or commercial business or entity that purchases or attempts to purchase the energy-efficient products as exempt under this section commits an unfair method of competition in violation of s. 501.204, punishable as provided in s. 501.2075. The Department of Revenue may adopt rules under ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to administer this section. Section 2. Paragraph (b) of subsection (2) and subsection

(7) of section 377.806, Florida Statutes, are amended, and

paragraphs (c) and (d) are added to subsection (2) of that section, to read:

- 377.806 Solar Energy System Incentives Program. --
- (2) SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC SYSTEM INCENTIVE. --

- (b) Rebate amounts.--The rebate amount shall be set at \$4 per watt based on the total wattage rating of the system. Only one rebate shall be allowed per system. The maximum allowable rebate per solar photovoltaic system installation shall be as follows:
  - 1. Twenty thousand dollars for a residence.
- 2. One hundred thousand dollars for a place of business, a publicly owned or operated facility, or a facility owned or operated by a private, not-for-profit organization, including condominiums or apartment buildings.
- (c) Rebate preapproval.--General contractors may receive rebate preapproval for a qualifying solar photovoltaic system if the system will be installed in a new home during construction of the home.
- (d) Rules.--The Florida Public Service Commission shall adopt rules necessary to implement the provisions of this subsection, including amending current interconnection standards for solar energy systems up to 100 kilowatts and providing for net metering of solar energy systems up to 100 kilowatts as defined in this section and in accordance with current Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc., standards for solar energy systems.

(7) RULES.--The department shall adopt rules pursuant to ss. 120.536(1) and 120.54 to develop rebate applications <u>and preapproval processes</u> and administer the issuance of rebates.

Section 3. The Legislature finds that there is a need to develop a program to educate the public about solar energy and promote the Solar Energy System Incentives Program.

Section 4. The Department of Environmental Protection shall establish and publicize a toll-free hotline that provides information about solar photovoltaic energy and the solar photovoltaic energy system incentive described in s. 377.806, Florida Statutes. The department shall also create promotional materials to publicize the solar photovoltaic system incentive.

Section 5. For the 2007-2008 fiscal year, the sum of \$61,379 is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Revenue for the purpose of administering the energy-efficient products sales tax holiday pursuant to s. 212.0803, Florida Statutes.

Section 6. For the 2007-2008 fiscal year, the sum of \$17,174,000 in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund and \$12,826,000 in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the Grants and Donations Trust Fund in the Department of Environmental Protection for the purpose of funding the Renewable Energy Technologies Grants Program established in s. 377.804, Florida Statutes. Of the general revenue funds, \$10 million are contingent upon the coordination between the Department of Environmental Protection and the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services pursuant to s. 377.804(6), Florida Statutes.

Section 7. For the 2007-2008 fiscal year, the sum of \$5
million in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General
Revenue Fund to the Department of Environmental Protection for
the purpose of funding commercial and consumer solar incentives
authorized in s. 377.806, Florida Statutes.

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Section 8. For the 2007-2008 fiscal year, the sum of \$50,000 in nonrecurring funds is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Department of Environmental Protection for the purpose of publicizing solar photovoltaic energy.

Section 9. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
