17	Section 1. Subsection (6) of section 1007.35, Florida
18	Statutes, is amended to read:

21	(6) The partnership shall:
22	(a) Provide teacher training and professional development
23	to enable teachers of AP or other advanced courses to have the
24	necessary content knowledge and instructional skills to prepare
25	students for success on AP or other advanced course examinations
26	and mastery of postsecondary course content.
27	(b) Provide to middle school teachers and administrators
28	professional development that will enable them to educate middle
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29 school students at the level necessary to prepare the students30 to enter high school ready to participate in advanced courses.

Provide teacher training and materials that are 31 (C) 32 aligned with the Sunshine State Standards and are consistent with best theory and practice regarding multiple learning styles 33 and research on learning, instructional strategies, 34 35 instructional design, and classroom assessment. Curriculum materials must be based on current, accepted, and essential 36 37 academic knowledge. Materials for prerequisite courses should, at a minimum, address the skills assessed on the Florida 38 Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT). 39

(d) Provide assessment of individual strengths and
weaknesses as related to potential success in AP or other
advanced courses and readiness for college.

(e) Provide college entrance exam preparation through a
variety of means that may include, but are not limited to,
training teachers to provide courses at schools; training
community organizations to provide courses at community centers,
faith-based organizations, and businesses; and providing on-line
courses.

(f) Consider ways to incorporate community colleges in themission of preparing all students for postsecondary success.

(g) Provide a plan for communication and coordination of
efforts with the Florida Virtual School's provision of on-line
AP or other advanced courses.

57	(i) Work with school districts to provide information to

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(h) Provide a plan of communication which includes, but 84 85 need not be limited to, disseminating to parents materials that emphasize the importance of AP or other advanced courses to a 86 87 student's ability to gain access to and to succeed in postsecondary education and materials that emphasize the 88 importance of the PSAT/NMSQT or PLAN, which provide diagnostic 89 90 feedback on skills and relate student scores to the probability of success on AP or other advanced course examinations, and also 91 92 the dissemination of such information to students, teachers, counselors, administrators, districts, community colleges, and 93 state universities. The department shall assist the partnership 94 in communicating opportunities and priorities to administrators, 95 teachers, and counselors whenever possible. 96
