Subsection (15) of section 121.021, Florida 11 12 Statutes, is amended to read: 13 121.021 Definitions.--The following words and phrases as used in this chapter have the respective meanings set forth 14 unless a different meaning is plainly required by the context: 15 (15)(a) Until October 1, 1978, "special risk member" 16 17 means any officer or employee whose application is approved by the administrator and who receives salary payments for work 18 performed as a peace officer; law enforcement officer; police 19 officer; highway patrol officer; custodial employee at a 20 correctional or detention facility; correctional agency 2.1 22 employee whose duties and responsibilities involve direct 23 contact with inmates, but excluding secretarial and clerical employees; firefighter; or an employee in any other job in the 2.4 field of law enforcement or fire protection if the duties of 25 such person are certified as hazardous by his or her employer. 26 27 (b) Effective October 1, 1978, "special risk member" means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is designated as a special risk member by the division in 29 accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as 30 a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, or a correctional

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officer and must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 121.0515.

- (c) Effective October 1, 1999, "special risk member" means a member of the Florida Retirement System who is designated as a special risk member by the division in accordance with s. 121.0515. Such member must be employed as a law enforcement officer, a firefighter, a correctional officer, an emergency medical technician, or a paramedic and must meet certain other special criteria as set forth in s. 121.0515.
- (d)1. Effective January 1, 2001, "special risk member" includes any member who is employed as a community-based correctional probation officer and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(e).
- 2. Effective January 1, 2001, "special risk member" includes any professional health care bargaining unit or non-unit member who is employed by the Department of Corrections or the Department of Children and Family Services and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(f).
- (e) Effective July 1, 2001, the term "special risk member" includes any member who is employed as a youth custody officer by the Department of Juvenile Justice and meets the special criteria set forth in s. 121.0515(2)(g).
- (f) Effective October 1, 2007, the term "special risk member" includes a person employed by an agency of state or local government as a public safety dispatcher or 911 operator whose duties and responsibilities include answering 911 calls; dispatching law enforcement, fire rescue services, emergency management services, and other public safety services to the scene of an emergency; and providing real-time information from federal, state, and local crime databases or supervising

or serving as command officer of a member or members having 2 such duties and responsibilities. However, the term does not include administrative support personnel, including, but not 3 4 limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel. 5 6 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 121.0515, Florida 7 Statutes, is amended to read: 8 121.0515 Special risk membership.--(2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special 9 risk member, must meet the following criteria: 10 (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement 11 12 officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 13 compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification 14 15 requirements of this paragraph. duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting 2 of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or 3 firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance 4 performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the 5 Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and 7 Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such 8 responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support 9 personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary 10 duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, 11 12 legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further 13 provided that all periods of creditable service in fire prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or 14 command officer of a member or members who have such 15 responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special 16 risk contribution rate, shall be included; 18 (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in 19 compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's 20 21 primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and 22 physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates 23 within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being 2.4 25 transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; 26 27 provided, however, administrative support personnel, 2.8 including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and 29 responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and 30 personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and 31

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assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in the Special Risk Class;

- Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of one or more members who have such responsibility. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- (e) The member must be employed as a community-based correctional probation officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, and counseling of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within the community; or the member must be the supervisor of a member or members who have such responsibilities. Administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal services, and personnel management, shall not be included; however, probation and parole circuit and deputy circuit administrators shall participate in the Special Risk Class;

responsibilities must include answering 911 calls; dispatching law enforcement, fire rescue services, emergency management services, and other public safety services to the scene of an emergency; and providing real-time information from federal, state, and local crime databases, or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such duties and responsibilities. However, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, are not included.
