19	(f) Effective October 1, 2007, the term "special risk
20	member " includes any member who is employed as an ocean water
21	rescue lifequard by an employer that is advanced certified by
22	the United States Lifesaving Association, who is certified in
23	compliance with s. 401.27 as an emergency medical technician
24	or paramedic, who works directly under the supervision of a
25	fire rescue department or is supervised by a medical director,
26	and who meets the special criteria set forth in s.
27	121.0515(2)(i).

- (2) CRITERIA.--A member, to be designated as a special risk member, must meet the following criteria:
- (a) The member must be employed as a law enforcement officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395; however, sheriffs and elected police chiefs shall be excluded from meeting the certification requirements of this paragraph. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include the pursuit, apprehension, and arrest of law violators or suspected law violators; or the member must be an active member of a bomb disposal unit whose primary responsibility is the location, handling, and disposal of explosive devices; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included;
- (b) The member must be employed as a firefighter and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 633.35 and be employed solely within the fire department of a local government employer or an agency of state government with firefighting responsibilities. In addition, the member's duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene fighting of fires, fire prevention, or firefighter training; direct supervision of firefighting units, fire prevention, or firefighter training; or aerial firefighting surveillance performed by fixed-wing aircraft pilots employed by the Division of Forestry of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such

responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support
personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary
duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing,
legal, and personnel, shall not be included and further
provided that all periods of creditable service in fire
prevention or firefighter training, or as the supervisor or
command officer of a member or members who have such
responsibilities, and for which the employer paid the special
risk contribution rate, shall be included;

- (c) The member must be employed as a correctional officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the custody, and physical restraint when necessary, of prisoners or inmates within a prison, jail, or other criminal detention facility, or while on work detail outside the facility, or while being transported; or the member must be the supervisor or command officer of a member or members who have such responsibilities; provided, however, administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary duties and responsibilities are in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; however, wardens and assistant wardens, as defined by rule, shall participate in the Special Risk Class;
- (d) The member must be employed by a licensed Advance Life Support (ALS) or Basic Life Support (BLS) employer as an emergency medical technician or a paramedic and be certified in compliance with s. 401.27. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must include on-the-scene emergency medical care or direct supervision of emergency medical technicians or paramedics, or the member must be the

- (g) The member must be employed as a youth custody officer and be certified, or required to be certified, in compliance with s. 943.1395. In addition, the member's primary duties and responsibilities must be the supervised custody, surveillance, control, investigation, apprehension, arrest, and counseling of assigned juveniles within the community; or
- (h) The member must be employed by a law enforcement agency or medical examiner's office in a forensic discipline recognized by the International Association for Identification and must qualify for active membership in the International Association for Identification. The member's primary duties and responsibilities must include the collection, examination, preservation, documentation, preparation, or analysis of physical evidence or testimony, or both, or the member must be the direct supervisor, quality management supervisor, or command officer of one or more individuals with such responsibility. Administrative support personnel, including, but not limited to, those whose primary responsibilities are clerical or in accounting, purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included; or:
- (i) The member must be employed as an ocean water rescue lifequard by an employer that is advanced certified by the United States Lifesaving Association, must be certified in compliance with s. 401.27 as an emergency medical technician or paramedic, and must maintain compliance with the United States Lifesaving Association's Fulltime Open Water Lifequard training standards. In addition, the member must work directly under the supervision of a fire rescue department or be supervised by a medical director and must have primary duties and responsibilities that include maintaining open water life-safety and on-the-scene emergency rescue and response to

1	emergencies in the water and on ocean-front beaches. However,
2	administrative support personnel, including, but not limited
3	to, those whose primary responsibilities are in accounting,
4	purchasing, legal, and personnel, shall not be included.
5	Section 3. The Legislature finds that a proper and
6	legitimate state purpose is served when employees and retirees
7	of the state and its political subdivisions and the
8	dependents, survivors, and beneficiaries of such employees and
9	retirees are extended the basic protections afforded by
10	governmental retirement systems. These persons must be
11	provided benefits that are fair and adequate and that are
12	managed, administered, and funded in a sound actuarial manner,
13	as required by s. 14, Art. X of the State Constitution and
14	part VII of chapter 112, Florida Statutes. Therefore, the
15	Legislature hereby determines and declares that this act
16	fulfills an important state interest.
17	Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2007.
