(2) Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, each public or private middle school in this state must provide to female students who are entering the 6th grade, and to the parent or guardian of such students, information concerning the connection between the human papillomavirus and cervical cancer and that a vaccine for preventing human papillomavirus is available to the student during the school year in order for the student to be admitted into the 8th grade.

(3) Beginning with the 2010-2011 school year, a female student who is entering the 7th grade may not be admitted to any private or public school in this state until the student submits to the school a certificate of immunization showing that the student has commenced the immunization protocol for the human papillomavirus or a written statement, signed by the parent or guardian of the student indicating that, after receiving information about the human papillomavirus, the parent or quardian has elected for the female student not to receive the immunization.

(4) Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, a principal or any other person in charge of a public or private school may not knowingly admit a female student into the 8th grade until the student submits to the school a certification of immunization for the prevention of the human papillomavirus showing the protocol for the immunization has been completed or a written statement, signed by the parent or guardian of the student indicating that, after receiving information about the human papillomavirus, the parent or guardian has elected for the female student not to receive the immunization.

(5) The Department of Education, in consultation with

the Department of Health, shall prescribe the content of the
