15	(a) A person who the clerk or the court determines is
16	indigent for civil proceedings under this section shall:
17	1. Be enrolled in a payment plan under s. 28.246; or
18	2. Have all costs waived for court services listed in
19	s. 57.081 if the indigent person's income is equal to or below
20	150 percent of the then-current federal poverty quidelines
21	prescribed for the size of the household of the applicant by
22	the United States Department of Health and Human Services or
23	if the indigent person is receiving Temporary Assistance for
24	Needy Families-Cash Assistance, poverty-related veteran's
25	benefits, or Supplemental Security Income (SSI).
26	(b) An indigent person enrolled in a payment plan and
27	shall be charged a one-time administrative processing charge
28	under s. 28.24(26)(c). A monthly payment amount, calculated
29	based upon all fees and all anticipated costs, is presumed to
30	correspond to the person's ability to pay if it does not
31	exceed 2 percent of the person's annual net income, as defined

in subsection (1), divided by 12. The person may seek review of the clerk's decisions regarding a payment plan established under s. 28.246 in the court having jurisdiction over the matter. A case may not be impeded in any way, delayed in filing, or delayed in its progress, including the final hearing and order, due to nonpayment of any fees by an indigent person. Section 2.
