The order granting temporary custody may redirect all (b) 121 or part of an existing child support obligation to be paid to 122 the extended family member or another person interested in the 123 124 welfare of a minor child who is granted temporary custody of the 125 child. If the court redirects an existing child support 126 obligation, the order granting temporary custody must include, 127 if possible, the determination of arrearages owed to the obligee and the person awarded temporary custody and must order payment 128 129 of the arrearages. The clerk of the circuit court in which the 130 temporary custody order is entered shall transmit a certified copy thereof to the court originally entering the child support 131 132 order.
