2 An act relating to building code hurricane preparedness; providing a short title; amending s. 553.73, F.S.; 3 4 providing intent with respect to the effect of building 5 code modifications on wind protection; requiring uniform application of certain standards relating to wind-borne 6 debris and structural guidelines; prohibiting code 7 modification that diminishes construction requirements; 8 9 prescribing a date by which counties and municipalities 10 must enforce certain windborne debris protections and structural guidelines; requiring the Florida Building 11 Commission to develop voluntary guidelines for increasing 12 the hurricane resistance of buildings; requiring that the 13 guidelines be included in the commission's report to the 14 2008 Legislature; providing an effective date. 15 16 17 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 18 19 Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Uniform Building 20 Code Act." Section 2. Subsection (3) of section 553.73, Florida 21 22 Statutes, is amended, and subsection (12) is added to that section, to read: 23 24 553.73 Florida Building Code.--The commission shall select from available national or 25 (3)international model building codes, or other available building 26 27 codes and standards currently recognized by the laws of this state, to form the foundation for the Florida Building Code. 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29 commission may modify the selected model codes and standards as 30 needed to accommodate the specific needs of this state, but only to the extent that any such modifications strengthen, not 31 32 weaken, the structural integrity of buildings constructed in compliance with the Florida Building Code as it relates to wind 33 protection. Standards or criteria referenced by the selected 34 35 model codes shall be similarly incorporated by reference. If a referenced standard or criterion requires amplification or 36 37 modification to be appropriate for use in this state, only the 38 amplification or modification shall be specifically set forth in 39 the Florida Building Code. The Florida Building Commission may approve technical amendments to the code after the amendments 40 41 have been subject to the following conditions:

(a) The proposed amendment has been published on the
commission's website for a minimum of 45 days and all the
associated documentation has been made available to any
interested party before any consideration by any Technical
Advisory Committee;

(b) In order for a Technical Advisory Committee to make a
favorable recommendation to the commission, the proposal must
receive a three-fourths vote of the members present at the
Technical Advisory Committee meeting and at least half of the
regular members must be present in order to conduct a meeting;

(c) After Technical Advisory Committee consideration and a recommendation for approval of any proposed amendment, the proposal must be published on the commission's website for not less than 45 days before any consideration by the commission; and

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(d) Any proposal may be modified by the commission based
on public testimony and evidence from a public hearing held in
accordance with chapter 120.

The commission shall incorporate within sections of the Florida 61 Building Code provisions which address regional and local 62 concerns and variations, but only to the extent that any such 63 provisions strengthen, not weaken, the structural integrity of 64 65 buildings constructed in compliance with the Florida Building 66 Code as it relates to wind protection. The commission shall make 67 every effort to minimize conflicts between the Florida Building Code, the Florida Fire Prevention Code, and the Life Safety 68 Code. 69

70 (12)Upon the effective date of this act, each county and 71 municipality in this state shall, at a minimum, enforce the 72 wind-borne debris protections and structural guidelines adopted 73 by the American Society of Civil Engineers in the standard 74 commonly referred to as ASCE 7-02. Notwithstanding the 75 provisions of section 109 of chapter 2000-141, Laws of Florida, 76 the Florida Building Commission shall amend the Florida Building 77 Code to require application of ASCE 7-02 throughout the state and to eliminate all exceptions providing less stringent 78 79 requirements. Provisions of the Florida Building Code, including those contained in referenced standards and criteria, relating 80 81 to wind resistance shall not be amended pursuant to this subsection to diminish construction requirements, although the 82 83 commission may amend the provisions to enhance those construction requirements. 84

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85 Section 3. The Florida Building Commission shall develop 86 voluntary "Code Plus" guidelines for increasing the hurricane 87 resistance of buildings. The guidelines must be modeled on the requirements for the High Velocity Hurricane Zone and must 88 identify products, systems, and methods of construction that the 89 90 commission anticipates could result in stronger construction. The commission shall include these guidelines in its report to 91 92 the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 93 Representatives in the 2008 Regular Session of the Legislature. 94 Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

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
