In addition, all female cattle each calf shall be (b) 20 21 individually identified at the time of vaccination, if not already identified by tattoo, electronic identification device, 22 23 or brand, by an official vaccination ear tag in the right ear. The tag shall include the designated state prefix, followed by 24 the letter "V," two additional letters, and four numerals. 25 26 Registration tattoos, electronic identification devices, or individual brand numbers may be substituted for the official ear 27 28 tags. This identification shall be accurately recorded on the 29 official vaccination record.

30 (c) Duplicate reports covering these vaccinations shall be
 31 immediately furnished to the department and shall constitute the
 32 official record of vaccination.

(3) Each owner of a herd of cattle in this state shall 33 34 enroll the herd in a program to determine whether the herd is infected with brucellosis. When reactors or suspects are 35 disclosed in a herd, the department and the owner must develop a 36 37 plan to eliminate the infection in accordance with the Uniform Methods and Rules for Brucellosis Eradication and the rules of 38 this state. The plan shall include the required testing, removal 39 of reactor animals, calfhood vaccination and whole herd 40 vaccination to clear the herd of infection. The department shall 41 42 provide for the establishment of low brucellosis incidence areas and brucellosis free areas which can be recognized by the United 43 44 States Department of Agriculture as having Class "Free," Class 489953

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45 "A, " or Class "B" status under the Uniform Methods and Rules for 46 Brucellosis Eradication. (2) (4) Only an approved vaccine produced under license of 47 the United States Department of Agriculture shall qualify for 48 49 vaccination purposes under this section. Section 2. 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charge or fee imposed on the gift certificate or credit memo, 73 including, but not limited to, service charges, dormancy fees, 74 75 account maintenance fees, or cash-out fees. However, a gift certificate may have an expiration date of not less than 3 years 76 77 if it is provided as a charitable contribution when no 78 consideration is given to the issuer by the consumer, or not 79 less than 1 year if it is provided as a benefit pursuant to an 80 employee-incentive program, consumer-loyalty program, or promotional program when no consideration is given to the issuer 81 82 by the consumer, and the expiration date is prominently disclosed in writing to the consumer at the time it is provided. 83 84 In addition, a gift certificate may have an expiration date if it the monetary consideration for the gift certificate it is 85 86 provided to the recipient through a loyalty program, or promotional program, or if it is provided in conjunction with as 87 part of a larger package related to a convention, conference, 88 vacation, or sporting or fine arts event having a limited 89 duration so long as the majority of the value paid by the 90 recipient is attributable to the convention, conference, 91 vacation, or event. An issuer may honor a gift certificate that 92 93 has expired on or before the effective date of this act.

94 (b) Paragraph (a) does not apply to a gift certificate or
95 credit memo sold or issued by a financial institution, as
96 defined in s. 655.005, or by a money transmitter, as defined in
97 s. 560.103, if the gift certificate or credit memo is redeemable
98 by multiple unaffiliated merchants.
