9	(2) PAY SUPPLEMENTS STRUCTUREMerit Award Program plans
10	shall provide for the annual disbursement of merit-based pay
11	supplements to high-performing employees in the manner described
12	in this subsection. <u>Merit Award Program funds shall be</u>
13	appropriated in the General Appropriations Act that is effective
14	on July 1 of the fiscal year in which the merit-based pay
15	supplements are distributed pursuant to paragraph (a). These
16	funds shall be released and distributed to eligible school
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17 districts on or before July 31 for distribution to eligible
18 recipients by October 1 of that fiscal year.

Each Merit Award Program plan must designate the top 19 (a) instructional personnel and school-based administrators to be 20 21 outstanding performers and pay to each such employee who remains employed by a Florida public school or who retired after 22 23 qualifying for the award, by October September 1 of the following school year, a merit-based pay supplement of at least 24 5 percent of the average teacher's salary for that school 25 26 district not to exceed 10 percent of the average teacher's salary for that school district. The amount of a merit award may 27 28 not be based on length of service or base salary. Pay supplements shall be funded from moneys appropriated by the 29 30 Legislature under this section and from any additional funds that are designated by the district for the Merit Award Program. 31 School districts are not required to implement this section 32 unless the program is specifically funded by the Legislature. By 33 November October 1 of each year, each school district shall 34 provide documentation to the Department of Education concerning 35 the expenditure of legislative appropriations for merit-based 36 37 pay, and shall refund undisbursed appropriations to the department. If such undisbursed funds are not remitted to the 38 department by November 1, the department shall withhold an 39 equivalent amount from the district's allocation of 40 appropriations made under s. 1011.62. 41

42 (b) A Merit Award Program plan may include additional pay
43 supplements under this section for employees who manifest
44 exemplary work attendance.

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45 (c) Merit-based pay supplements shall be awarded in addition to any general increase or other adjustments to 46 salaries which are made by a school district. An employee's 47 eligibility for or receipt of merit-based pay supplements shall 48 49 not adversely affect that employee's opportunity to qualify for or to receive any other compensation that is made generally 50 51 available to other similarly situated district school board 52 employees.

53 Section 2. Subsection (2) of section 1012.72, Florida 54 Statutes, is amended to read:

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1012.72 Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching Program.--

56 (2)The Dale Hickam Excellent Teaching Program is created 57 to provide categorical funding for monetary incentives and 58 bonuses for teaching excellence. The Department of Education shall distribute to each school district or to the NBPTS an 59 amount as prescribed annually by the Legislature for the Dale 60 Hickam Excellent Teaching Program. If the appropriation is 61 insufficient to fund the monetary incentives and bonuses as 62 described in this subsection, such incentives and bonuses shall 63 be prorated so that total program expenditures equal the 64 65 appropriation. For purposes of this section, the Florida School for the Deaf and the Blind shall be considered a school 66 district. Unless otherwise provided in the General 67 Appropriations Act, each distribution shall be the sum of the 68 69 amounts earned for the following incentives and bonuses: 70 A fee subsidy to be paid by the Department of (a) Education to the NBPTS on behalf of each individual who is an 71 72 employee of a district school board or a public school within 156805

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the school district, who is certified by the district to have 73 demonstrated satisfactory teaching performance pursuant to s. 74 75 1012.34 and who satisfies the prerequisites for participating in the NBPTS certification program, and who agrees, in writing, to 76 77 pay 10 percent of the NBPTS participation fee and to participate 78 in the NBPTS certification program during the school year for 79 which the fee subsidy is provided. The fee subsidy for each 80 eligible participant shall be an amount equal to 90 percent of the fee charged for participating in the NBPTS certification 81 82 program. The fee subsidy is a one-time award and may not be duplicated for any individual. 83

(b) A portfolio-preparation incentive of \$150 paid by the
Department of Education to each teacher employed by a district
school board or a public school within a school district who is
participating in the NBPTS certification program. The portfoliopreparation incentive is a one-time award paid during the school
year for which the NBPTS fee subsidy is provided.

(c) An annual bonus equal to 10 percent of the prior 90 fiscal year's statewide average salary for classroom teachers to 91 be distributed to the school district to be paid to each 92 93 individual who holds NBPTS certification and is employed by the district school board or by a public school within the school 94 district. The district school board shall distribute the annual 95 bonus to each individual who meets the requirements of this 96 paragraph and who is certified annually by the district to have 97 demonstrated satisfactory teaching performance pursuant to s. 98 99 1012.34. The annual bonus may be paid as a single payment or 100 divided into not more than three payments.

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101 (d) An annual bonus equal to 10 percent of the prior fiscal year's statewide average salary for classroom teachers to 102 103 be distributed to the school district to be paid to each individual who meets the requirements of paragraph (c) and 104 105 agrees, in writing, to provide the equivalent of 12 workdays of mentoring and related services to public school teachers within 106 107 the state who do not hold NBPTS certification. Related services must include instruction in helping teachers work more 108 effectively with the families of their students. The district 109 110 school board shall distribute the annual bonus in a single payment following the completion of all required mentoring and 111 112 related services for the year. It is not the intent of the Legislature to remove excellent teachers from their assigned 113 114 classrooms; therefore, credit may not be granted by a school district or public school for mentoring or related services 115 provided during student contact time during the 196 days of 116 117 required service for the school year.

(e) The employer's share of social security and Medicare taxes and Florida Retirement System contributions for those teachers who qualify for NBPTS certification and receive bonus amounts.

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123 A teacher for whom the state pays the certification fee and who 124 does not complete the certification program or does not teach in 125 a public school of this state for at least 1 year after 126 completing the certification program must repay the amount of 127 the certification fee to the state. 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129	NBPTS certification is not required to repay the amount of the
130	certification fee if the teacher meets the 1-year teaching
131	requirement. Repayment is not required of a teacher who does not
132	complete the certification program or fails to fulfill the
133	teaching requirement because of the teacher's death or
134	disability or because of other extenuating circumstances as
135	determined by the State Board of Education.
