17	SECTION 8. Clemency
18	(a) Except in cases of treason and in cases where
19	impeachment results in conviction, and except as otherwise
20	prescribed by law, the governor may, by executive order filed
21	with the custodian of state records, suspend collection of fines
22	and forfeitures, grant reprieves not exceeding sixty days and,
23	with the approval of two members of the cabinet, grant full or
24	conditional pardons, restore civil rights, commute punishment,
25	and remit fines and forfeitures for offenses.
26	(b) In cases of treason the governor may grant reprieves
27	until adjournment of the regular session of the legislature
28	convening next after the conviction, at which session the
29	legislature may grant a pardon or further reprieve; otherwise the

31	(c) There may be created by law a parole and probation
32	commission with power to supervise persons on probation and to
33	grant paroles or conditional releases to persons under sentences
34	for crime. The qualifications, method of selection and terms,
35	not to exceed six years, of members of the commission shall be
36	prescribed by law.
