25	HEALTH WARNING
26	ALCOHOL IN BEER, COOLERS, WINE, AND LIQUOR CAN CAUSE:
27	1. FETAL ALCOHOL SYNDROME AND BIRTH DEFECTS. DO NOT DRINK
28	DURING PREGNANCY.
29	2. DRUNK DRIVING. DO NOT DRINK BEFORE DRIVING A CAR,
30	OPERATING A BOAT, OR OPERATING MACHINERY.
31	3. ADDICTION.
32	4. DEATH. DO NOT MIX ALCOHOL WITH OTHER DRUGS, INCLUDING
33	PRESCRIPTION OR ILLEGAL DRUGS. THE COMBINATION CAN BE FATAL.

35	(c) The division shall produce health warning signs that
36	comply with paragraph (b) and distribute the signs to the
37	licensed vendors operating establishments that sell alcoholic
38	beverages for consumption on or off the premises. The division
39	shall impose a fee and collect from each vendor an amount
40	sufficient to cover the costs of printing and delivering the
41	signs.
42	(2) A vendor of alcoholic beverages may not sell any
43	alcoholic beverage unless the vendor has properly posted the
44	health warning signs required under subsection (1). Any vendor
45	who violates this subsection commits a misdemeanor of the second
46	degree, punishable as provided in s. 775.082 or s. 775.083.

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Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2008.

warning signs to be displayed on the premises of vendors

Beverages and Tobacco to produce the signs and charge a
fee to cover the costs of the signs; providing penalties
for failure to display the signs as required; providing
an effective date.

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
