A bill to be entitled

An act relating to physical education; amending s. 1003.455, F.S.; adding requirements regarding a school district's physical education policy; adding a condition to existing physical education requirements; requiring physical education in grades 6 through 8; providing exceptions under certain circumstances; providing an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

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Section 1. Section 1003.455, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

It is the responsibility of each district school board

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1003.455 Physical education; assessment.--

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to develop a physical education program that stresses physical fitness and encourages healthful, active lifestyles and to

18 19 encourage all students in prekindergarten through grade 12 to participate in physical education. Physical education shall

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consist of physical activities of at least a moderate intensity

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level and for a duration sufficient to provide a significant

health benefit to students, subject to the differing

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capabilities of students. All physical education programs and

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curricula must be reviewed by a certified physical education instructor.

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(2) Each district school board shall adopt a written physical education policy that details the school district's

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physical education program, the and expected program outcomes,

the benefits of physical education, and the availability of oneon-one counseling concerning the benefits of physical education.

(3) Each district school board, except as otherwise permitted under subsection (4), shall provide:

- (a) One hundred fifty 150 minutes of physical education each week, of which at least 30 consecutive minutes must be provided on any day that physical education is provided, for students in kindergarten through grade 5 and students in grade 6 who are enrolled in a school that contains one or more elementary grades; and
- (b) Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, one class period per day, or the equivalent, of physical education for one semester of each school year for students in grade 6 who are enrolled in a school that does not contain an elementary grade and for students in grades 7 and 8.

Students enrolled in such instruction shall be reported through the periodic student membership surveys, and records of such enrollment shall be audited <u>under pursuant to</u> s. 1010.305. Such instruction may be provided by any instructional personnel as defined in s. 1012.01(2), regardless of certification, who are designated by the school principal. Each district school board is encouraged to provide 225 minutes of physical education each week for students in grades 6 through 8.

(4) A district school board is not required to provide physical education for a student in grade 6 who is enrolled in a school that does not contain an elementary grade and for students in grades 7 and 8 if:

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- (b) The schedule for the student's courses of study cannot be modified to provide adequate time for physical education without interfering with the student's normal progression or enrollment in a remedial course.
 - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
