HB 1377 2008

A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; amending s. 1009.532, F.S.; requiring a student to complete a specified number of community service or internship hours in order to be eligible to renew a scholarship under the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; allowing a student to restore eligibility if such hours are insufficient for renewal; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (1) of section 1009.532, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1009.532 Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; student eligibility requirements for renewal awards.--

(1) To be eligible to renew a scholarship from any of the three types of scholarships under the Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program, a student must:

(a) Complete at least 12 semester credit hours or the equivalent in the last academic year in which the student earned a scholarship.

(b) Beginning with the 2010-2011 incoming freshman class of a postsecondary educational institution, complete at least 20 hours of unpaid community service or an unpaid internship within the state as approved and administered by the Department of Education during the last academic year in which the student earned a scholarship. The student may choose to perform unpaid

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community service or complete an unpaid internship with any of the following entities, including, but not limited to:

- 1. A municipal or county government, the state government, or the Federal Government;
  - 2. A not-for-profit organization; or
  - 3. A service learning program.

- $\underline{\text{(c)}}$  (b) Maintain the cumulative grade point average required by the scholarship program, except that:
- 1. If a recipient's grades fall beneath the average required to renew a Florida Academic Scholarship, but are sufficient to renew a Florida Medallion Scholarship or a Florida Gold Seal Vocational Scholarship, the Department of Education may grant a renewal from one of those other scholarship programs, if the student meets the renewal eligibility requirements;
- 2. If, at any time during the eligibility period, a student's grades are insufficient to renew the scholarship, the student may restore eligibility by improving the grade point average to the required level. A student is eligible for such a restoration one time. The Legislature encourages education institutions to assist students to calculate whether or not it is possible to raise the grade point average during the summer term. If the institution determines that it is possible, the education institution may so inform the department, which may reserve the student's award if funds are available. The renewal, however, must not be granted until the student achieves the required cumulative grade point average. If the summer term is not sufficient to raise the grade point average to the required

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renewal level, the student's next opportunity for renewal is the fall semester of the following academic year; or

- 3. If, at any time during the eligibility period, a student's community service or internship hours are insufficient to renew the scholarship, the student may restore eligibility by completing the hours for which the student is deficient. A student is eligible for such a restoration one time. The student must inform the Department of Education that restoration is sought, and at such time the department may reserve the student's award if funds are available. The renewal, however, must not be granted until the student completes the required hours for which the student is deficient. If the summer term is not sufficient to complete the required hours for renewal, the student's next opportunity for renewal is the fall semester of the following academic year at which time the student must complete the hours required for restoration and the hours required for renewal; or
- 4.3. If a student is receiving a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship, is a servicemember of the Florida National Guard or United States Reserves while attending a postsecondary institution, is called to active duty or state active duty, as defined in s. 250.01, prior to completing his or her degree, and meets all other requirements for the scholarship, the student shall be eligible to continue the scholarship for 2 years after completing active duty or state active duty.
  - Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
