174 technicians and paramedics is a public necessity. This exemption 175 is justified because if such information were not confidential, 176 an emergency medical technician or paramedic or a member or 177 members of his or her family could be harmed or threatened with 178 harm by an individual, or a family member of such individual, who 179 was provided emergency medical care that resulted in a negative 180 outcome. The exemption is further justified because emergency 181 medical technicians and paramedics are subject to the same 182 exposure as law enforcement officers and firefighters, who are 183 protected by an exemption from public-records requirements for 184 personal identifying and location information pertaining to the 185 law enforcement officers, firefighters, and their families. 186 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
