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Section 2. Section 1004.445, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1004.445 Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and

Research Institute. --

The Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and (1) Research Institute is established within the University of South Florida. The center shall work in collaboration with other state universities on programs directly relating to research, education, treatment, prevention, and early detection of Alzheimer's disease.

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- (2) The center shall be administered by a director of operations, who shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the president of the University of South Florida.
- (3) A research advisory board is created, to be comprised of seven members, of leading researchers, physicians, and scientists. The members of the board shall be appointed as follows: two members appointed by the Governor, one member appointed by the President of the Senate, one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and three members appointed by the president of the University of South Florida. Each member must have significant scientific research experience in order to be appointed. Each member of the board shall be appointed to serve a 2-year term and may be reappointed to the board. The board shall review programs and recommend research priorities and initiatives to maximize the state's investment in the center.
- The center's research activities shall be administered by the director of research. The director of research shall be appointed by the president of the University of South Florida from a list of recommended candidates submitted by the research advisory board.
- (5) The center may fund applications for Alzheimer's disease research submitted from any university or established research institute in the state. All qualified investigators in the state, regardless of institutional affiliation, shall have equal access and opportunity to compete for the research funding awarded by the center in support of its mission. Grants shall be awarded by the center on the basis of scientific merit, as determined by an open, competitive peer review process that ensures objectivity, consistency, and high quality.

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- (6) The center may not expend more than 20 percent of the funds appropriated for administrative purposes.
- (7) The University of South Florida shall establish a separate account within the university's foundation for charitable donations received for the center's purposes as described in this section.
- (8) With the exception of charitable donations for the center deposited into the separate account within the University of South Florida's foundation, the University of South Florida shall establish and maintain separate accounts for all other funds appropriated to, dedicated for, or generated by the center.
- The center shall provide an annual report to the Governor and Cabinet, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chair of the Board of Governors. The annual report shall describe the expenditure of all funds and shall provide information regarding research that has been conducted or funded by the center, as well as the expected and actual results of such research.
- (10) The following information is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24, Art. I of the State Constitution:
- (a) Personal identifying information relating to clients of programs created or funded through the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute that is held by the center, the University of South Florida, the Board of Governors, or the State Board of Education;
- (b) Medical or health records relating to patients held by the center;
- (c) Materials that relate to methods of manufacture or production, potential trade secrets, potentially patentable material, actual trade secrets as defined in s. 688.002, or

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proprietary information received, generated, ascertained, or discovered during the course of research conducted by or through the center and business transactions resulting from such research;

- (d) The personal identifying information of a donor or prospective donor to the center who wishes to remain anonymous; and
- (e) Any information received by the center from a person from another state or nation or the Federal Government that is otherwise confidential and exempt pursuant to the laws of that state or nation or pursuant to federal law.

Any governmental entity that demonstrates a need to access such confidential and exempt information in order to perform its duties and responsibilities shall have access to such information.

- (11) By June 1, 2011, the Division of Statutory Revision of the Office of Legislative Services shall certify to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives the language and statutory citation of this section, which is scheduled to expire January 1, 2013.
- (12) The Legislature shall review the performance, the outcomes, and financial management of the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute during the 2010 Regular Session of the Legislature and shall determine the most appropriate funding source and means of funding the center based on its review.
- This section expires January 1, 2013, unless reviewed and reenacted by the Legislature before that date.

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Section 3. No later than June 1, 2008, the board of directors of the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute shall provide a final audit of assets of the not-for-profit corporation as described in s. 1004.445, Florida Statutes, to the President of the University of South Florida and the chair of the Board of Governors to assist in the transfer of the institute to the University of South Florida. This section shall take effect upon becoming a law.

Section 4. The board of directors of the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute shall transfer all assets and functions of the institute to the University of South Florida by July 1, 2008. Charitable donations shall be deposited into the account established pursuant to s. 1004.445(7). All other funds shall be deposited into appropriate accounts established pursuant to s. 1004.445(8).

Section 5. All contracts held by the not-for-profit corporation and any for-profit or not-for-profit corporate subsidiaries as described in s. 1004.445, Florida Statutes, shall be transferred to the University of South Florida by July 1, 2008.

Section 6. The board of directors of the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute and the not-forprofit corporation as described in s. 1004.445, Florida Statutes, are dissolved effective July 1, 2008.

Section 7. Except as otherwise expressly provided in this act and except for this section, which shall take effect upon becoming a law, this act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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An act relating to state universities; amending s. 1009.24, F.S.; revising requirements for the Board of Governors in establishing tuition and out-of-state fees for graduate and professional programs; revising requirements for the Board of Governors in establishing a uniform maximum undergraduate tuition differential for universities that have research and development expenditures of a specified amount; allowing the university board of trustees to maintain the differential unless otherwise directed by the Board of Governors; providing an exemption from payment of the tuition differential for beneficiaries of a prepaid tuition contract that was in effect on July 1, 2008; amending s. 1004.445, F.S.; establishing the Johnnie B. Byrd, Sr., Alzheimer's Center and Research Institute within the University of South Florida; providing for the administration of the center; creating a research advisory board and providing for a manner of appointment; providing duties; eliminating the board of directors and the council of scientific advisors; revising the grant award process for the center; providing a limitation on expenditures; requiring the university to establish an account for charitable donations and separate accounts for other funds; providing for a report; extending the sunset provisions; providing effective dates.
