Senators Wise, King, and Hill moved the following amendment:

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## Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Between line(s) 1330 and 1331, insert:

Section 24. Paragraphs (f) and (g) of subsection (1) of section 1012.985, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

1012.985 Statewide system for inservice professional development. --

The intent of this section is to establish a statewide (1)system of professional development that provides a wide range of targeted inservice training to teachers, managers, and administrative personnel designed to upgrade skills and knowledge needed to reach world class standards in education. The system shall consist of a network of professional development academies in each region of the state which are operated in partnership with area business partners to develop and deliver high-quality



training programs purchased by school districts. The academies shall be established to meet the human resource development needs of professional educators, schools, and school districts. Funds appropriated for the initiation of professional development academies shall be allocated by the Commissioner of Education, unless otherwise provided in an appropriations act. To be eligible for startup funds, the academy must:

- (f) Be financed during the first year of operation by an equal or greater match from private funding sources and demonstrate the ability to be self-supporting within 1 year after opening through fees for services, grants, or private contributions. Thereafter, the academy shall operate through contracts with one or more school districts and through grants, private contributions, or other business arrangements consistent with the mission of the academy. Regional educational consortia as defined in s. 1001.451 which serve rural areas of critical economic concern are exempt from the funding match required by this paragraph.
- (g) Own or lease a facility that can be used to deliver training onsite and through distance learning and other technology-based delivery systems, and have entered into such partnerships or agreements as necessary to carry out the intent of this paragraph. The participating district school boards may lease a site or facility to the academy for a nominal fee and may pay all or part of the costs of renovating a facility to accommodate the academy. The academy is responsible for all operational, maintenance, and repair costs.
