agricultural implement or an agricultural tractor not exceeding 18 130 inches in width, is authorized for the purpose of 19 20 transporting peanuts, grains, soybeans, cotton, hay, straw, or 21 other perishable farm products from their point of production to 22 the first point of change of custody or of long-term storage, and 23 for the purpose of returning to such point of production, or for 24 the purpose of moving such tractors, movers, and implements from one point of agricultural production to another, by a person 25 26 engaged in the production of any such product or custom hauler, 27 if such vehicle or combination of vehicles otherwise complies with this section. The Department of Transportation may issue 28 29 overwidth permits for implements of husbandry greater than 130 30 inches, but not more than 170 inches, in width. The Department of Transportation may issue overlength permits for cotton module 31 movers greater than 50 feet but not more than 55 feet in overall 32 length. Such vehicles shall be operated in accordance with all 33 34 safety requirements prescribed by law and rules of the Department 35 of Transportation.

36 (b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, equipment not exceeding 136 inches in width and not capable of speeds 37 exceeding 20 miles per hour which is used exclusively for 38 harvesting forestry products is authorized for the purpose of 39 40 transporting equipment from one point of harvest to another point 41 of harvest, not to exceed 10 miles, by a person engaged in the 42 harvesting of forestry products. Such vehicles must be operated during daylight hours only, in accordance with all safety 43 requirements prescribed by s. 316.2295(5) and (6). 44

45 (c) The width and height limitations of this section shall
46 not apply to farming or agricultural equipment, whether self47 propelled, pulled or hauled, when temporarily operated during

48	daylight hours upon a public road which is not a limited access
49	facility as defined in s. 334.03(13), and the width and height
50	limitations may be exceeded by such equipment without a permit.
51	To be eligible for this exemption, the equipment shall be
52	operated within a radius of 50 miles of the real property of the
53	equipment owner. However, farming or agricultural equipment
54	greater than 174 inches in width is required to have one warning
55	lamp mounted on each side of the equipment to denote the width,
56	and a slow moving vehicle sign. Warning lamps required by this
57	paragraph are required to be visible from the front and rear of
58	the vehicle and must be visible from a distance of 1000 feet.
59	(d) The operator of equipment operated under this subsection
60	is responsible for verifying that the route used has adequate
61	clearance for the equipment.
