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I. Summary:

The Committee Substitute for Senate Bill 2140 re-creates the Welfare Transition Trust Fund, FLAIR number 62-2-401, within the Department of Military Affairs (DMA). The trust fund serves as a respository for funds collected from the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF) Block Grant. The bill has an effective date of July 1, 2009.

This bill repeals section 250.175(5)(d), Florida Statutes.

II. Present Situation:

Article III, Section 19(f) of the Florida Constitution requires the termination of all state trust funds within 4 years of their initial creation, unless exempt by the Constitution or operation of law. The Legislature has placed agency funds on a staggered review cycle to facilitate the review process associated with trust fund termination, modification, or recreation.

The Welfare Transition Trust Fund consists of funds collected from the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) Block Grant. These moneys are used exclusively for providing services to individuals eligible for Temporary Assistance for Needy Families. The Forward March and About Face programs in the DMA are the recipients of these funds. In Fiscal Year 2007-2008, the Legislature appropriated \$5,300,000 which was the anticipated amount of receipts.

The Welfare Transition Trust fund within the Department of Military Affairs will be re-created prior to the scheduled termination date of July 1, 2009.
