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Section 6. The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability, in cooperation with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, shall:

- 1. Assess current safeguards for the accuracy of the criminal history data contained in the Florida Department of Law Enforcement's Computerized Criminal History (CCH) database.
- 2. Assess the current process available to potential private employers or licensing entities in determining whether an applicant has a criminal history.
- 3. Assess whether an adequate process exists to allow the potential private employer or licensing entity to determine



whether an applicant's response to an "arrest, conviction or adjudication withheld" criminal history question on an application is truthful and complete.

- 4. Assess the feasibility of establishing appropriate privacy safeguards to protect job or license applicants, such as providing informed consent and the opportunity to review a criminal history record before a job or licensing application is made, before the criminal history record is provided to the potential employer or licensing entity, and before adverse action is taken by the potential employer or licensing entity.
- 5. Identify actions that could be taken to improve both the completeness of the criminal history record and the consumer readability of the criminal history record.

The Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability shall report its findings to the President of the Senate and Speaker of the House of Representatives no later than February 1, 2009.
