A bill to be entitled

An act relating to the Gertrude Maxwell Save a Pet Act; providing a short title; creating s. 570.236, F.S.; creating a direct-support organization for the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services; providing for the organization and operation of the direct-support organization; providing for a contract; providing for a board of directors; providing for the use of property, facilities, and personal services of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services by the direct-support organization; providing restrictions; providing for the deposit of moneys; providing for an annual audit; providing limits on the direct-support organization; specifying inapplicability of potentially conflicting provision of law; providing an effective date.

WHEREAS, it is estimated that over 800,000 homeless, discarded, abandoned, stray, and unclaimed dogs and cats are euthanized in the state each year, and

WHEREAS, in 7 years one female cat and her offspring can theoretically produce 420,000 cats, and in 6 years one female dog and her offspring can theoretically produce 67,000 dogs, and

WHEREAS, the cost to spay or neuter pets and feral cats is about \$20-\$70 per animal, while the approximate cost to capture, house, feed, and eventually euthanize a homeless animal is about \$100, and

WHEREAS, reducing euthanasia of unwanted animals can save lives of companion animals and potential service animals and

save tax dollars and many homeless animals can be trained as service animals and therapy animals, NOW, THEREFORE,

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

- Section 1. This act may be cited as the "Gertrude Maxwell Save a Pet Act."
- Section 2. Section 570.236, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

570.236 Gertrude Maxwell Save a Pet Direct-Support Organization.--

- (1) AUTHORITY.--The Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services is authorized to create a direct-support organization to prevent animal cruelty, assist pet overpopulation management, provide grants to animal shelters for the purpose of spaying and neutering, and reduce the need for euthanasia of animals, which shall be designated the Gertrude Maxwell Save a Pet Direct-Support Organization.
- (a) The direct-support organization must be a Florida corporation not for profit, incorporated under the provisions of chapter 617. The direct-support organization shall be exempt from paying fees under s. 617.0122.
- (b) The direct-support organization shall be organized and operated to conduct programs and activities; raise funds; request and receive grants, gifts, and bequests of moneys; acquire, receive, hold, invest, and administer, in its own name, securities, funds, objects of value, or other property, real or personal; and make expenditures to or for the direct or indirect

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benefit of the purposes of preventing animal cruelty, assisting pet overpopulation management, providing grants to animal shelters for spaying and neutering, and reducing the need for euthanasia of animals.

- (c) If the Commissioner of Agriculture determines the direct-support organization is operating in a manner that is inconsistent with the goals and purposes of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services or not acting in the best interest of the state, the commissioner may terminate the contract and thereafter the organization may not use the department's name.
- (2) CONTRACT.--The direct-support organization shall operate under a written contract with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. The written contract must, at a minimum, provide for:
- (a) Approval of the articles of incorporation and bylaws of the direct-support organization by the Commissioner of Agriculture.
- (b) Submission of an annual budget for approval by the Commissioner of Agriculture.
- (c) The reversion without penalty to the Department of
  Agriculture and Consumer Services or to the state, if the
  Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services ceases to exist,
  of all moneys and property held in trust by the direct-support
  organization to be used for the prevention of cruelty to animals
  and pet overpopulation management if the direct-support
  organization ceases to exist or if the contract is terminated.

(d) The fiscal year of which must begin July 1 of each year and end June 30 of the following year.

- (e) The disclosure of material provisions of the contract and the distinction between the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services and the direct-support organization to donors of gifts, contributions, or bequests, as well as on all promotional and fundraising publications.
- (3) BOARD OF DIRECTORS.--The Commissioner of Agriculture shall appoint a board of directors for the direct-support organization. The commissioner may designate employees of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to serve on the board of directors. Members of the board shall serve at the pleasure of the commissioner.
- (4) USE OF PROPERTY AND SERVICES.--The Commissioner of Agriculture:
- (a) May authorize the use of facilities and property other than moneys that are owned by the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services to be used by the direct-support organization.
- (b) May authorize the use of personal services provided by employees of the Department of Agriculture and Consumer

  Services. For the purposes of this section, the term "personal services" includes full-time personnel and part-time personnel as well as payroll processing.
- (c) May prescribe the conditions under which the direct-support organization may use property, facilities, or personal services of the office.
- (d) Shall not authorize the use of property, facilities, or personal services of the direct-support organization if the

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organization does not provide equal employment opportunities to
all persons, regardless of race, color, religion, sex, age, or
national origin.

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- (5) MONEYS.--Moneys of the direct-support organization may be held in a separate depository account in the name of the direct-support organization and shall be subject to the provisions of the contract with the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services.
- (6) ANNUAL AUDIT.--The direct-support organization shall provide for an annual financial audit in accordance with s. 215.981.
- (7) LIMITS ON DIRECT-SUPPORT ORGANIZATION.--The direct-support organization shall not exercise any power under s.
  617.0302(12) or (16). No state employee shall receive compensation from the direct-support organization for service on the board of directors or for services rendered to the direct-support organization.
- (8) INAPPLICABILITY OF SECTION 570.903.--The provisions of s. 570.903 do not apply to the direct-support organization created by this section.
- Section 3. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
