3	s. 350.01, F.S.; revising the deadline for a sitting
4	member of the Public Service Commission to give notice of
5	intent to seek reappointment; conforming the beginning of
6	a Public Service Commissioner's term as chair with the
7	beginning of terms of commissioners; amending s. 350.012,
8	F.S.; renaming the Committee on Public Service Commission
9	Oversight, a standing joint committee of the Legislature,
10	as the "Committee on Public Counsel Oversight"; deleting
11	the committee's authority to recommend to the Governor
12	nominees to fill vacancies on the Public Service
13	Commission; deleting the committee's authority to file an
14	ethics complaint against a member, former member, or
15	former employee of the commission, or a member of the
16	Public Service Commission Nominating Council; amending s.
17	350.031, F.S.; increasing the number of members on the
18	council; providing for initial appointments to the
19	expanded council to establish staggered terms; requiring
20	the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House
21	of Representatives to appoint a chair and vice chair to
22	the council in alternating years; requiring the council to
23	submit recommendations for vacancies on the Public Service
24	Commission to the Governor; requiring the council to
25	nominate a minimum of three persons for each vacancy;
26	revising the date that recommendations for vacancies must
27	be submitted; providing for the council to fill a vacancy
28	on the commission if the Governor fails to do so;
29	authorizing a successor Governor to recall an unconfirmed

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30	appointee under certain circumstances; amending ss.
31	350.061 and 350.0614, F.S., relating to the appointment,
32	oversight, and compensation of the Public Counsel;
33	conforming provisions to changes made by the act;

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36	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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38	Section 1. Subsections (3) and (4) of section 350.01,
39	Florida Statutes, are amended to read:
40	350.01 Florida Public Service Commission; terms of
41	commissioners; vacancies; election and duties of chair; quorum;
42	proceedings
43	(3) Any person serving on the commission who seeks to be
44	appointed or reappointed shall file with the nominating council
45	no later than June 1 prior to the year in which his or her term
46	<u>expires</u> at least 210 days before the expiration of his or her
47	term a statement that he or she desires to serve an additional
48	term.
49	(4) One member of the commission shall be elected by
50	majority vote to serve as chair for a term of 2 years, beginning
51	on January 2 of the first year of the term <del>with the first Tuesday</del>
52	after the first Monday in January 1979. A member may not serve
53	two consecutive terms as chair.
54	Section 2. Section 350.012, Florida Statutes, is amended to
55	read:
56	350.012 Committee on Public <u>Counsel</u> Service Commission
57	Oversight; creation; membership; powers and duties

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58 (1)There is created a standing joint committee of the 59 Legislature, designated the Committee on Public Counsel Service 60 Commission Oversight, and composed of 12 members appointed as follows: six members of the Senate appointed by the President of 61 62 the Senate, two of whom must be members of the minority party; 63 and six members of the House of Representatives appointed by the 64 Speaker of the House of Representatives, two of whom must be 65 members of the minority party. The terms of members shall be for 66 2 years and shall run from the organization of one Legislature to 67 the organization of the next Legislature. The President shall appoint the chair of the committee in even-numbered years and the 68 69 vice chair in odd-numbered years, and the Speaker of the House of 70 Representatives shall appoint the chair of the committee in odd-71 numbered years and the vice chair in even-numbered years, from 72 among the committee membership. Vacancies shall be filled in the 73 same manner as the original appointment. Members shall serve 74 without additional compensation, but shall be reimbursed for 75 expenses.

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(2) The committee shall:

77 (a) Recommend to the Governor nominees to fill a vacancy on 78 the Public Service Commission, as provided by general law; and

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(b) appoint a Public Counsel as provided by general law.

80 (3) The committee is authorized to file a complaint with 81 the Commission on Ethics alleging a violation of this chapter by 82 a commissioner, former commissioner, former commission employee, 83 or member of the Public Service Commission Nominating Council.

84 <u>(3)</u>(4) The committee will not have a permanent staff, but 85 the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of

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86 Representatives shall select staff members from among existing 87 legislative staff, when and as needed.

88 Section 3. Subsections (1), (5), (6), (7), and (8) of 89 section 350.031, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

90 350.031 Florida Public Service Commission Nominating 91 Council.--

92 There is created a Florida Public Service Commission (1)93 Nominating Council consisting of 12 nine members. At least one 94 member of the council must be 60 years of age or older. Six Three 95 members, including three members one member of the House of Representatives, one of whom must be a member of the minority 96 97 party, shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the 98 Speaker of the House of Representatives. Six; three members, 99 including three members one member of the Senate, one of whom 100 must be a member of the minority party, shall be appointed by and 101 serve at the pleasure of the President of the Senate; and three 102 members shall be selected and appointed by a majority vote of the 103 other six members of the council. All terms shall be for 4 years 104 except those members of the House and Senate, who shall serve 2-105 year terms concurrent with the 2-year elected terms of House 106 members. However, to establish staggered terms, all terms ongoing 107 on July 1, 2008, shall continue until and shall expire on January 108 2, 2009, and new appointments shall be made for terms to begin on 109 that date, with each appointing officer to appoint one nonlegislator member to a 1-year term, three legislator members 110 111 to 2-year terms, one nonlegislator member to a 3-year term, and 112 one nonlegislator member to a 4-year term. The President of the 113 Senate shall appoint the chair of the council in even-numbered 114 years and the vice chair in odd-numbered years, and the Speaker

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115 of the House of Representatives shall appoint the chair of the 116 council in odd-numbered years and the vice chair in even-numbered 117 years, from among the council membership. Vacancies on the 118 council shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term in 119 the same manner as original appointments to the council. A member may not be reappointed to the council, except for a member of the 120 121 House of Representatives or the Senate who may be appointed to 122 two 2-year terms or a person who is appointed to fill the 123 remaining portion of an unexpired term.

124 (5) A person may not be nominated to the Governor Committee 125 on Public Service Commission Oversight until the council has 126 determined that the person is competent and knowledgeable in one 127 or more fields, which shall include, but not be limited to: public affairs, law, economics, accounting, engineering, finance, 128 129 natural resource conservation, energy, or another field 130 substantially related to the duties and functions of the 1.31 commission. The commission shall fairly represent the above-1.32 stated fields. Recommendations of the council shall be 133 nonpartisan.

134 It is the responsibility of the council to nominate to (6) 135 the Governor no fewer than three Committee on Public Service 136 Commission Oversight six persons for each vacancy occurring on 137 the Public Service Commission. The council shall submit the 138 recommendations to the Governor committee by September 15 August 139 1 of those years in which the terms are to begin the following 140 January, or within 60 days after a vacancy occurs for any reason 141 other than the expiration of the term.

142 (7) The Committee on Public Service Commission Oversight
 143 shall select from the list of nominees provided by the nominating

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council three nominees for recommendation to the Governor for 144 145 appointment to the commission. The recommendations must be 146 provided to the Governor within 45 days after receipt of the list 147 of nominees. The Governor shall fill a vacancy occurring on the 148 Public Service Commission by appointment of one of the applicants nominated by the council committee only after a background 149 150 investigation of such applicant has been conducted by the Florida 151 Department of Law Enforcement. If the Governor has not made an 152 appointment within 30 consecutive calendar days after the receipt 153 of the recommendation, the council committee, by majority vote, 154 shall appoint, within 30 days after the expiration of the Governor's time to make an appointment, one person from the 155 156 applicants previously nominated to the Governor to fill the 157 vacancy.

(8) Each appointment to the Public Service Commission shall
be subject to confirmation by the Senate during the next regular
session after the vacancy occurs. If the Senate refuses to
confirm or <u>fails to consider</u> rejects the Governor's appointment,
the council shall initiate, in accordance with this section, the
nominating process within 30 days.

164 (9) When the Governor makes an appointment and that 165 appointment has not been confirmed by the Senate before the appointing Governor's term ends, a successor Governor may, within 166 167 30 days after taking office, recall the appointment and, prior to 168 the first day of the next regular session, make a replacement 169 appointment from the list provided to the previous Governor by 170 the council. Such an appointment is subject to confirmation by 171 the Senate at the next regular session following the creation of 172 the vacancy to which the appointments are being made. If the

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173 replacement appointment is not timely made, or if the appointment 174 is not confirmed by the Senate for any reason, the council, by 175 majority vote, shall appoint, within 30 days after the 176 Legislature adjourns sine die, one person from the applicants 177 previously nominated to the Governor to fill the vacancy, and 178 this appointee is subject to confirmation by the Senate during 179 the next regular session following the appointment.

180 Section 4. Subsection (1) of section 350.061, Florida181 Statutes, is amended to read:

182 350.061 Public Counsel; appointment; oath; restrictions on
183 Public Counsel and his or her employees.--

184 (1) The Committee on Public Counsel Service Commission 185 Oversight shall appoint a Public Counsel by majority vote of the 186 members of the committee to represent the general public of 187 Florida before the Florida Public Service Commission. The Public 188 Counsel shall be an attorney admitted to practice before the 189 Florida Supreme Court and shall serve at the pleasure of the 190 Committee on Public Counsel Service Commission Oversight, subject 191 to biennial reconfirmation by the committee. The Public Counsel 192 shall perform his or her duties independently. Vacancies in the 193 office shall be filled in the same manner as the original 194 appointment.

195 Section 5. Subsection (2) of section 350.0614, Florida 196 Statutes, is amended to read:

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350.0614 Public Counsel; compensation and expenses.--

(2) The Legislature declares and determines that the Public
Counsel is under the legislative branch of government within the
intention of the legislation as expressed in chapter 216, and no
power shall be in the Executive Office of the Governor or its

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successor to release or withhold funds appropriated to it, but the same shall be available for expenditure as provided by law and the rules or decisions of the Committee on Public <u>Counsel</u> <del>Service Commission</del> Oversight.

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Section 6. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.
