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WHEREAS, upon receipt of the report, the Joint Legislative

Any such person who fails to surrender such licenses or 126 who makes a false affidavit concerning such licenses is guilty of 127 a misdemeanor of the first degree, punishable as provided in s. 128 775.082 or s. 775.083.

129 A person who does not drive a commercial motor vehicle (b) 130 is not required to surrender a license issued by another 131 jurisdiction, upon a showing to the department that such license 132 is necessary because of employment or part-time residence. Any 133 person who retains a driver's license because of employment or 1.34 part-time residence shall, upon qualifying for a license in this 135 state, be issued a driver's license which shall be valid within 136 this state only. All surrendered licenses may be returned by the 1.37 department to the issuing jurisdiction together with information 138 that the licensee is now licensed in a new jurisdiction or may be 139 destroyed by the department, which shall notify the issuing 140 jurisdiction of such destruction. A person may not have more than 141 one valid Florida driver's license at any time.
