18	paper, or writing of any kind, or otherwise advertise or

23	transacted that is regulated by this state as an escrow agent.
24	(2) This section, does not apply to:
25	(a) A financial institution as defined in s. 655.005;
26	(b) An attorney who is a member of The Florida Bar or his
27	or her law firm;
28	(c) A person who is licensed pursuant to chapter 475 or his
29	or her brokerage firm; or
30	(d) A title insurance agent who is licensed pursuant to s.
31	626.8417, a title insurance agency that is licensed pursuant to
32	s. 626.8418, or a title insurer who is authorized to transact
33	business in this state pursuant to s. 624.401.
34	(3) Any person aggrieved by a violation of this section may
35	bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction to obtain a
36	declaratory judgment that an act or practice violates this

38	(4) In any action brought by a person who has suffered a
39	loss as a result of a violation of this section, such person may
40	recover actual damages, plus attorney's fees and court costs.
41	(5) Any person who willfully violates this section commits
