2	An act relating to textbook affordability; creating s.
3	1004.09, F.S.; prohibiting certain actions of community
4	college or state university employees that relate to
5	student purchase of required textbooks; authorizing
6	receipt of certain instructional materials, compensation,
7	and training; requiring student notification of required
8	textbooks; requiring adoption of specified policies and
9	practices to minimize the cost of textbooks; providing an
10	effective date.

12	WHEREAS, textbooks are an essential part of a comprehensive
13	and high-quality postsecondary education, and
14	WHEREAS, the availability and affordability of textbooks
15	directly impact the quality and affordability of postsecondary
16	education, and
17	WHEREAS, the United States Government Accountability Office
18	recently reported that in the last two decades college textbook
19	prices have increased at twice the rate of inflation, and
20	WHEREAS, the United States Government Accountability Office
21	reported that, while many factors affect textbook pricing, the
22	increasing costs associated with developing instructional
23	supplements to accompany textbooks best explain price increases
24	in recent years, and
25	WHEREAS, the United States Government Accountability Office
26	reported that college textbook prices in the United States may
27	exceed prices in other countries because prices reflect market
28	conditions found in each country, such as the willingness and
29	ability of students to purchase the textbook, and

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30	WHEREAS, the cost of textbooks is one component considered
31	in making federal and state-funded financial aid awards, and, as
32	such, escalating textbook prices can impact federal and state
33	spending, and
34	WHEREAS, state universities and community colleges should
35	consider the least costly practices in assigning textbooks when
36	such practices are educationally sound, NOW, THEREFORE,

38	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

40	Section 1. Section 1004.09, Florida Statutes, is created to

43	(1) No employee of a community college or state university
44	may demand or receive any payment, loan, subscription, advance,
45	deposit of money, service, or anything of value, present or
46	promised, in exchange for requiring students to purchase a
47	specific textbook for coursework or instruction.
48	(2) An employee may receive:
49	(a) Sample copies, instructor copies, or instructional
50	materials.
51	(b) Royalties or other compensation from sales of textbooks
52	that include the instructor's own writing or work.
53	(c) Honoraria for academic peer review of course materials.
54	(d) Fees associated with activities such as reviewing,
55	critiquing, or preparing support materials for textbooks pursuant
56	to guidelines adopted by the State Board of Education or the
57	Board of Governors.
58	(e) Training in the use of course materials and learning

605-07000-08 20082350c1 59 technologies. 60 (3) Community colleges and state universities shall post on their websites, as early as is feasible, but not less than 30 61 62 days prior to the first day of class for each term, a list of 63 each textbook required for each course offered at the institution 64 during the upcoming term. The posted list must include the 65 International Standard Book Number (ISBN) for each required 66 textbook or other identifying information, which must include, at 67 a minimum, all of the following: the title, all authors listed, 68 publishers, edition number, copyright date, published date, and other relevant information necessary to identify the specific 69 70 textbook or textbooks required for each course. The State Board 71 of Education and the Board of Governors shall include in the 72 policies, procedures, and guidelines adopted under subsection (4) 73 certain limited exceptions to this notification requirement for 74 classes added after the notification deadline. 75 (4) By March 1, 2009, the State Board of Education and the 76 Board of Governors each shall adopt policies, procedures, and 77 guidelines for implementation by community colleges and state universities, respectively, that further efforts to minimize the 78 79 cost of textbooks for students attending such institutions while 80 maintaining the quality of education and academic freedom. The 81 policies, procedures, and guidelines shall provide for the 82 following: 83 (a) That textbook adoptions are made with sufficient lead 84 time to bookstores so as to confirm availability of the requested materials and, where possible, ensure maximum availability of 85 86 used books. 87 That, in the textbook adoption process, the intent to (b)

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88	use all items ordered, particularly each individual item sold as
89	part of a bundled package, is confirmed by the course instructor
90	or the academic department offering the course before the
91	adoption is finalized.
92	(c) That a course instructor or the academic department
93	offering the course determines, before a textbook is adopted, the
94	extent to which a new edition differs significantly and
95	substantively from earlier versions and the value of changing to
96	a new edition.
97	(d) That the establishment of policies shall address the
98	availability of required textbooks to students otherwise unable
99	to afford the cost.
100	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
