2	An act relating to postsecondary tuition rates; creating
3	s. 1009.286, F.S.; providing legislative intent; requiring
4	that freshmen entering a secondary institution after a
5	specified date who exceed 150 percent of the number of
6	credit hours required to receive a degree must pay an
7	increase of 50 percent per credit hour above the normal
8	in-state tuition rate; requiring that the institution
9	provide counseling and advisement to a student under
10	certain circumstances; requiring the Department of
11	Education to develop a performance-based methodology for
12	community colleges to help students meet their academic
13	goals; providing that a student may be granted an
14	exemption from the increased tuition rate; providing an
15	effective date.

17	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

19	Section 1. Section 1009.286, Florida Statutes, is created
20	to read:
21	1009.286 Additional payment for credit hours exceeding
22	graduation requirements
23	(1) It is the intent of the Legislature to encourage each
24	undergraduate student in postsecondary education to complete the
25	student's respective degree program in the most efficient way
26	possible while, at the same time, providing for access to
27	additional college coursework. The Legislature therefore intends
28	to enact a policy that provides incentives for efficient degree
29	completion and requires a student to pay 50 percent more than the

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30 in-state tuition rate for each credit hour in excess of 150 31 percent of the number of credit hours required to complete the 32 degree program in which he or she is enrolled. 33 (2) This section applies to each freshman entering 34 postsecondary education as a first-time college student in the 35 2008 fall semester and to all first-time college freshmen 36 thereafter. 37 (3) For purposes of this section, the term "first-time 38 college student" means a student attending a state postsecondary 39 institution for the first time who has no prior credit toward a 40 degree or formal award from any other postsecondary institution 41 and who is enrolled in college-level courses pursuing completion 42 of a degree. 43 (4) Each community college district board of trustees may 44 enact policies requiring counseling and advising for any student 45 subject to this section prior to completion of 24 earned credit 46 hours to ensure that the student is making efficient and 47 appropriate progress toward a degree. 48 (5) Any student subject to this section who has earned 49 credits in excess of 120 percent of the required credit hours 50 toward completion of his or her degree program shall meet with an 51 advisor in order to prepare an educational plan outlining 52 efficient completion of his or her degree prior to registering 53 for further classes. 54 The Department of Education shall develop a (6) 55 performance-based budgeting methodology to encourage community 56 colleges to support students in progressing quickly toward their 57 academic goal. Specifically, the methodology should measure and 58 reward the following policy goals:

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59	(a) Increase the percentage of students graduating with
60	fewer than 120 percent of the credit hours needed to complete a
61	degree;
62	(b) Decrease the number of unqualified withdrawals; and
63	(c) Decrease the number of students persisting towards
64	their academic goal with more than 120 percent of the credit
65	hours required for a degree.
66	(7) Any student subject to this section who has earned in
67	excess of 150 percent of the credit hours required for completion
68	of his or her degree shall pay an increase of 50 percent per
69	credit hour above the normal in-state tuition rate. A student may
70	be granted an exemption from the additional fee only if an appeal
71	has been granted by the postsecondary institution based upon
72	documented extenuating circumstances.
73	Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
