Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: Section 1. Section 16.615, Florida Statutes, is amended to read: 16.615 Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys. --(1)The Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys is established within the Department of Legal Affairs and shall consist of 19 members appointed as follows: Two members of the Senate who are not members of the (a) same political party, appointed by the President of the Senate with the advice of the Minority Leader of the Senate. Two members of the House of Representatives who are (b) not members of the same political party, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives with the advice of the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives. The Secretary of Children and Family Services or his (C) or her designee. (d) The director of the Mental Health Program Office within the Department of Children and Family Services or his or her designee.

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(e) The <u>Secretary of Health</u> State Surgeon General or his
or her designee.

31 (f) The Commissioner of Education or his or her designee.

(g) The Secretary of Corrections or his or her designee.

(h) The Attorney General or his or her designee.

34 (i) The Secretary of Management Services or his or her35 designee.

36 (j) The director of the Agency for Workforce Innovation or37 his or her designee.

38 (k) A businessperson who is an African American, as
 39 defined in s. 760.80(2), of black origin appointed by the
 40 Governor.

(1) Two persons appointed by the President of the Senate
who are not members of the Legislature or employed by state
government. One of the appointees must be a clinical
psychologist.

(m) Two persons appointed by the Speaker of the House of
Representatives who are not members of the Legislature or
employed by state government. One of the appointees must be an
Africana studies professional.

(n) The deputy secretary for Medicaid in the Agency for
Health Care Administration or his or her designee.

(0) The Secretary of Juvenile Justice or his or herdesignee.

53 (2) Each member of the council shall be appointed to a 454 year term; however, for the purpose of providing staggered
55 terms, of the initial appointments, 9 members shall be appointed
56 to 2-year terms and 10 members shall be appointed to 4-year

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57 terms. A member of the council may be removed at any time by the 58 member's appointing authority who shall fill the vacancy on the 59 council.

(3) (a) At the first meeting of the council each year, themembers shall elect a chair and a vice chair.

(b) A vacancy in the office of chair or vice chair shallbe filled by vote of the remaining members.

(4) (a) The council shall make a systematic study of the
conditions affecting black men and boys, including, but not
limited to, homicide rates, arrest and incarceration rates,
poverty, violence, drug abuse, death rates, disparate annual
income levels, school performance in all grade levels including
postsecondary levels, and health issues.

(b) The council shall propose measures to alleviate and correct the underlying causes of the conditions described in paragraph (a). These measures may consist of changes to the law or systematic changes that can be implemented without legislative action.

(c) The council may study other topics suggested by theLegislature or as directed by the chair of the council.

(d) The council shall receive suggestions or comments
pertinent to the applicable issues from members of the
Legislature, governmental agencies, public and private
organizations, and private citizens.

81 (5) The Office of the Attorney General shall provide staff82 and administrative support to the council.

(6) The council shall meet quarterly and at other times at
 the call of the chair or as determined by a majority of council
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85 members and approved by the Attorney General.

86 (7) Eleven of the members of the council shall constitute
87 a quorum, and an affirmative vote of a majority of the members
88 present is required for final action.

(8) (a) The council shall issue its first annual report by December 15, 2007, and by December 15 each following year, stating the findings, conclusions, and recommendations of the council. The council shall submit the report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the chairpersons of the standing committees of jurisdiction in each chamber.

96 (b) The initial report must include the findings of an
97 investigation into factors causing black-on-black crime from the
98 perspective of public health related to mental health, other
99 health issues, cultural disconnection, and cultural identity
100 trauma.

(9) Members of the council shall serve without compensation. Members are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061. State officers and employees shall be reimbursed from the budget of the agency through which they serve. Other members may be reimbursed by the Department of Legal Affairs.

(10) The council and any subcommittees it forms <u>are</u> shall
be subject to the provisions of chapter 119, related to public
records, and the provisions of chapter 286, related to public
meetings.

(11) Each member of the council who is not otherwise required to file a financial disclosure statement pursuant to s. Page 4 of 5

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113 8, Art. II of the State Constitution or s. 112.3144, must file a 114 disclosure of financial interests pursuant to s. 112.3145. (12) Notwithstanding subsection (6), the Attorney General 115 shall: 116 117 (a) Within 60 days after the effective date of this act, fix a date for the initial meeting of the council. 118 119 (b) Notify each member of the council of the time, date, and place where the initial meeting will be held. 120 121 (c) Make any other arrangements concerning the initial meeting of the council. 122 (d) Serve as the presiding officer at the initial meeting 123 124 of the council until a chair is elected. (13) This section expires July 1, 2012, unless reenacted 125 126 by the Legislature. 127 Section 2. The sum of \$500,000 is appropriated from the 128 General Revenue Fund to the Department of Legal Affairs for the 129 purpose of paying administrative expenses necessary for the 130 Council on the Social Status of Black Men and Boys to carry out 131 its responsibilities under s. 16.615, Florida Statutes, during 132 the 2008-2009 fiscal year. 133 Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
