The workforce electronic benefit transfer 54 program shall be designed to enable an individual who receives an 55 56 electronic benefit transfer card under subsection (1) to use that 57 card for purposes of benefits provided under the workforce development system as well. The Department of Children and Family 58 59 Services shall assist Workforce Florida, Inc., in developing an 60 electronic benefit transfer program for the workforce development system that is fully compatible with the department's electronic 61 benefit transfer program.
