2	An act relating to maternal and child health programs;
3	amending s. 409.942, F.S.; requiring the Department of
4	Health to submit a plan for the implementation of a
5	electronic benefits transfer program for the dissemination
6	of Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) benefits to the
7	United States Department of Agriculture by a certain date
8	and to establish the program by a certain date; amending
9	s. 383.011, F.S.; requiring the Department of Health to
10	compare the average cost of certain food items and collect
11	individual food item redemption costs; prohibiting the
12	Department of Health from discontinuing a WIC-eligible
13	generic product; providing an exception; requiring that
14	the department expend funds provided by the Federal
15	Government only for administering the program; authorizing
16	the department to submit a budget amendment to the
17	Executive Office of the Governor if the department exceeds
18	the federal funds allocation; providing an effective date.

20	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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22	Section 1. Section 409.942, Florida Statutes, is amended
23	to read:
24	409.942 Electronic benefit transfer program
25	(1) The Department of Children and Family Services shall
26	establish an electronic benefit transfer program for the
27	dissemination of food stamp benefits and temporary assistance
28	payments, including refugee cash assistance payments, asylum
29	applicant payments, and child support disregard payments. If
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30 the Federal Government does not enact legislation or 31 regulations providing for dissemination of supplemental 32 security income by electronic benefit transfer, the state may 33 include supplemental security income in the electronic benefit 34 transfer program.

35 <u>(a) (2)</u> The department shall, in accordance with 36 applicable federal laws and regulations, develop minimum 37 program requirements and other policy initiatives for the 38 electronic benefit transfer program.

39 (b) (3) The department shall enter into public-private 40 contracts for all provisions of electronic transfer of public 41 assistance benefits.

42 (2) (4) Workforce Florida, Inc., through the Agency for 43 Workforce Innovation, shall establish an electronic benefit 44 transfer program for the use and management of education, 45 training, child care, transportation, and other program benefits under its direction. The workforce electronic benefit 46 transfer program shall fulfill all federal and state 47 48 requirements for Individual Training Accounts, Retention 49 Incentive Training Accounts, Individual Development Accounts, 50 and Individual Services Accounts. The workforce electronic 51 benefit transfer program shall be designed to enable an 52 individual who receives an electronic benefit transfer card 53 under subsection (1) to use that card for purposes of benefits 54 provided under the workforce development system as well. The 55 Department of Children and Family Services shall assist 56 Workforce Florida, Inc., in developing an electronic benefit 57 transfer program for the workforce development system that is 58 fully compatible with the department's electronic benefit

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59	transfer program. The agency shall reimburse the department for
60	all costs incurred in providing such assistance and shall pay
61	all costs for the development of the workforce electronic
62	benefit transfer program.
63	(3) The Department of Health shall:
64	(a) By January 1, 2009, submit a plan for approval by the
65	United States Department of Agriculture, Bureau of Food and
66	Nutrition Service, for the implementation of a statewide
67	electronic benefits transfer program for the dissemination of
68	benefits under the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for
69	Women, Infants, and Children (WIC), authorized by the Child
70	Nutrition Act. The plan shall be developed in consultation with
71	WIC vendors, including above-50-percent vendors.
72	(b) By July 1, 2010, establish a statewide electronic
73	benefit transfer program for the dissemination of benefits under
74	the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants,
75	and Children (WIC), authorized by the Child Nutrition Act. The
76	electronic benefit transfer program shall be implemented in
77	consultation with WIC vendors, including above-50-percent
78	vendors.
79	(c) Submit reports to the Speaker of the House and the
80	President of the Senate as to progress in obtaining federal
81	approval and establishing a statewide electronic benefit transfer
82	system by January 1, 2009, and by January 1, 2010.
83	Section 2. Subsection (3) is added to section 383.011,
84	Florida Statutes, to read:
85	383.011 Administration of maternal and child health
86	programs
87	(3) In administering the WIC program, the Department of

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88	Health:
89	(a) Upon implementation of an electronic benefit transfer
90	system and for the purposes of meeting the federal cost
91	neutrality requirement of 7 C.F.R. part 246, shall compare the
92	average cost of each food item redeemed by above-50-percent
93	vendors against the average cost of the same food item redeemed
94	by regular vendors.
95	(b) May not discontinue a WIC-eligible generic product
96	unless the product no longer meets the nutritional guidelines of
97	the WIC program.
98	(c) Shall expend funds provided by the Federal Government
99	only for purposes of administering the program. If the department
100	exceeds the allocation of federal funds, the department may
101	submit a budget amendment to the Executive Office of the Governor
102	requesting additional authority to use state trust fund moneys to
103	implement the program pursuant to s. 216.181(11).
104	Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
