22	(b) "Autism spectrum disorder" means any of the following
23	disorders as defined in the most recent edition of the Diagnostic
24	and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders of the American
25	Psychiatric Association:
26	1. Autistic disorder.
27	2. Asperger's syndrome.
28	3. Pervasive developmental disorder not otherwise
29	specified.
30	(c) "Health insurance plan" means a group health insurance
31	policy or group health benefit plan offered by an insurer which
32	includes the state group insurance program provided under s.
33	110.123. The term does not include any health insurance plan
34	offered in the individual market, any health insurance plan that
35	is individually underwritten, or any health insurance plan
36	provided to a small employer.
37	(d) "Insurer" means an insurer, health maintenance
38	organization, or any other entity providing health insurance
39	coverage which is licensed to engage in the business of insurance
40	in this state and is subject to insurance regulation.
41	(2) A health insurance plan shall provide coverage for
42	well-baby and well-child screening for diagnosing the presence of
43	autism spectrum disorder and the intervention and treatment of
44	autism spectrum disorder through speech therapy, occupational
45	therapy, physical therapy, applied behavior analysis, treatment
46	by a psychiatrist or psychologist, and any other necessary
47	medical care. Coverage provided under this section is limited to



48	treatment that is prescribed by the insured's treating medical
49	physician in accordance with a treatment plan. With regards to a
50	health insurance plan, an insurer may not deny or refuse to issue
51	coverage for, refuse to contract with, or refuse to renew or
52	reissue or otherwise terminate or restrict coverage for an
53	individual because the individual is diagnosed as having autism
54	spectrum disorder.
55	(3) The coverage required pursuant to subsection (2) may
56	not be subject to dollar limits, deductibles, or coinsurance
57	provisions that are less favorable to an insured than the dollar
58	limits, deductibles, or coinsurance provisions that apply to
59	physical illnesses that are generally covered under the health
60	insurance plan, except as otherwise provided for in subsection
61	(5). The coverage required in subsection (2) may not be denied on
62	the basis that provided services are habilitative in nature. The
63	coverage may not be subject to any limits on the number of visits
64	an insured may make to a service provider. However, the coverage
65	required pursuant to subsection (2) may be subject to other
66	general exclusions and limitations of the insurer's policy or
67	plan, including, but not limited to, coordination of benefits,
68	participating provider requirements, restrictions on services
69	provided by family or household members, and utilization review
70	of health care services, including the review of medical
71	necessity, case management, and other managed care provisions.
72	(4) The treatment plan required pursuant to subsection (2)
73	must include all elements necessary for the health insurance plan
74	to appropriately pay claims. These elements include, but are not
75	limited to, a diagnosis, the proposed treatment by type, the
76	frequency and duration of treatment, the anticipated outcomes
77	stated as goals, the frequency by which the treatment plan will

be updated, and the treating medical doctor's signature. A health insurance plan may request an updated treatment plan only once every 6 months from the treating medical doctor for purposes of reviewing medical necessity unless the health insurance plan and the treating medical doctor agree that a more frequent review is necessary due to emerging clinical circumstances.

84 (5) To be eligible for benefits and coverage under this 85 section, an individual must be diagnosed as having autistic 86 spectrum disorder at 8 years of age or younger. The benefits and 87 coverage provided pursuant to this section shall be provided to 88 any eligible person younger than 18 years of age or to any 89 eligible person 18 years of age or older who is in high school. 90 Coverage for therapy, as defined in subsection (2), is subject to a maximum benefit of \$36,000 per year. Beginning January 1, 2010, 91 92 this maximum benefit shall be adjusted annually on January 1 of each calendar year to reflect any change from the previous year 93 94 in the medical component of the then current Consumer Price Index, All Urban Consumers, as published by the United States 95 96 Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics.

97 (6) This section may not be construed as limiting benefits 98 and coverage otherwise available to an insured under a health 99 insurance plan.

100Section 3. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1) of section1011004.55, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

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1004.55 Regional autism centers.--

(1) Seven regional autism centers are established to provide nonresidential resource and training services for persons of all ages and of all levels of intellectual functioning who have autism, as defined in s. 393.063; who have a pervasive developmental disorder that is not otherwise specified; who have

108 an autistic-like disability; who have a dual sensory impairment; or who have a sensory impairment with other handicapping 109 110 conditions. Each center shall be operationally and fiscally independent and shall provide services within its geographical 111 112 region of the state. Service delivery shall be consistent for all 113 centers. Each center shall coordinate services within and between 114 state and local agencies and school districts but may not 115 duplicate services provided by those agencies or school 116 districts. The respective locations and service areas of the 117 centers are: The College of Medicine Department of Communication 118 (a) 119 Disorders at Florida State University, which serves Bay, Calhoun, 120 Escambia, Franklin, Gadsden, Gulf, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Leon, Liberty, Madison, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Taylor, Wakulla, 121 122 Walton, and Washington Counties. 123 Section 4. This act shall take effect January 1, 2009, and 124 applies to health insurance policies or plans issued, renewed, 125 entered into, or delivered on or after that date. 126 127 And the title is amended as follows: 128 129 Delete everything before the enacting clause
