WHEREAS, Florida has the second-longest coastline among the fifty states, having a total of 1,350 miles of coastline, and

WHEREAS, Florida's shoreline economy Gross State Product (GSP) is estimated to be approximately \$402 billion annually, two and a half times the estimated \$160 billion of its inland economy and representing 77 percent of the state's total economy, and

WHEREAS, by the year 2015, Florida's projected ocean tourism and recreation is expected to grow by 73 percent, creating more than 268,000 new jobs, and

WHEREAS, from 1990 to 2003, Florida's coastal counties increased employment by 31 percent, increased wages by 48 percent, and increased the GSP by 63 percent, far faster than the State of California, the Gulf States, or the nation, and

WHEREAS, the oceans and coastal resources of the state are held in trust for the people of the state and should be managed for the benefit of current and future generations, and

WHEREAS, Florida relies on its ocean and coastal systems for the welfare of its residents, and it is critical to work with many groups, including the Florida Oceans and Coastal Council, the Florida Ocean Alliance, and the Florida Coastal and Ocean Coalition, to improve the stewardship of the state's invaluable coastal resources, and

WHEREAS, Florida's coastal counties contribute more than 70 percent of the state's employment, population, and housing while covering only 56 percent of the state's land areas, and
