The Florida House of 17 Representatives, the Florida Senate, and the Office of the 18 19 Governor, the Secretary of State, and each Cabinet officer who heads a department that occupies office space in the Capitol, 20 21 shall institute a recycling program for their respective offices in the House and Senate office buildings and the Capitol. 22 Provisions shall be made to collect and sell wastepaper and 23 24 empty aluminum beverage cans generated by employee activities in these offices. The collection and sale of such materials shall 25 26 be coordinated with Department of Management Services recycling activities to maximize the efficiency and economy of this 27 program. 29 Representatives, the President of the Senate, the Secretary of 30 State, and the Cabinet officers may authorize the use of 31 proceeds from recyclable material sales for employee benefits 32 and other purposes, in order to provide incentives to their 33 respective employees for participation in the recycling program. 34 Such proceeds may also be used to offset any costs of the 35 recycling program.

Each state agency, the judicial branch of state 36 (2)37 government, and the State University System shall collect and sell, to the greatest extent practicable, aluminum, glass, and 38 plastic beverage containers, and other recyclable materials and 39 products used during the operation of facilities and offices and 40 may use the proceeds of the sale of such materials and products 41 for employee benefits and other purposes and thereby provide 42 incentives for employees to participate in the recycling 43 44 program. Such proceeds may also be used to offset any recycling 45 program costs.

Each organization, association, business, or 46 (3) 47 institution operating in the state and receiving state funds shall, to the greatest extent practicable, collect aluminum 48 49 beverage cans and recyclable plastic and glass at all locations 50 where the organization, association, business, or institution operates or does business, and shall offer such materials for 51 recycling. Each organization, association, business, or 52 53 institution may retain and use any proceeds received from the 54 sale of these materials for recycling to offset the cost associated with collecting and recycling such materials. 55 Each public airport operating in this state shall, to 56 (4)
