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1 A bill to be entitled 2 An act relating to recycling; amending s. 403.7145, F.S.; 3 requiring each organization, association, business, and institution operating in the state and receiving state 4 funds, and each public airport in the state, to collect 5 aluminum beverage cans and recyclable plastic and glass 6 7 from its place of business, or from the entities doing 8 business at the airport, and to offer such materials for 9 recycling; providing legislative intent; encouraging public school districts to recycle certain materials; 10 providing an effective date. 11 12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida: 13 14 Section 1. Section 403.7145, Florida Statutes, is amended 15 16 to read: 403.7145 Recycling.--17 The Capitol and the House and Senate office buildings 18 (1)constitute the Capitol recycling area. The Florida House of 19 20 Representatives, the Florida Senate, and the Office of the 21 Governor, the Secretary of State, and each Cabinet officer who heads a department that occupies office space in the Capitol, 22 shall institute a recycling program for their respective offices 23 24 in the House and Senate office buildings and the Capitol. 25 Provisions shall be made to collect and sell wastepaper and 26 empty aluminum beverage cans generated by employee activities in these offices. The collection and sale of such materials shall 27 be coordinated with Department of Management Services recycling 28 Page 1 of 3

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29 activities to maximize the efficiency and economy of this program. The Governor, the Speaker of the House of 30 31 Representatives, the President of the Senate, the Secretary of 32 State, and the Cabinet officers may authorize the use of proceeds from recyclable material sales for employee benefits 33 and other purposes, in order to provide incentives to their 34 35 respective employees for participation in the recycling program. Such proceeds may also be used to offset any costs of the 36 37 recycling program.

Each state agency, the judicial branch of state 38 (2) 39 government, and the State University System shall collect and sell, to the greatest extent practicable, aluminum, glass, and 40 plastic beverage containers, and other recyclable materials and 41 42 products used during the operation of facilities and offices and 43 may use the proceeds of the sale of such materials and products 44 for employee benefits and other purposes and thereby provide incentives for employees to participate in the recycling 45 program. Such proceeds may also be used to offset any recycling 46 47 program costs.

Each organization, association, business, or 48 (3) 49 institution operating in the state and receiving state funds 50 shall, to the greatest extent practicable, collect aluminum beverage cans and recyclable plastic and glass at all locations 51 where the organization, association, business, or institution 52 operates or does business, and shall offer such materials for 53 recycling. Each organization, association, business, or 54 55 institution may retain and use any proceeds received from the sale of these materials for recycling to offset the cost 56

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57 associated with collecting and recycling such materials. (4) Each public airport operating in this state shall, to 58 the greatest extent practicable, collect aluminum beverage cans 59 60 and recyclable plastic and glass from the airlines and other 61 entities doing business at the airport and offer such materials 62 for recycling. Each airport may retain and use any proceeds 63 received from the sale of these materials for recycling to 64 offset the costs associated with collecting and recycling such 65 materials. Airport administration offices, airport vendors, and 66 airlines are encouraged to coordinate the collection of 67 recyclable waste to the greatest extent practicable. The 68 provisions of this subsection are not intended to interfere with any already established recycling activity. 69 70 Public school districts are encouraged to conduct (5) recycling programs to the extent practicable and may substitute 71 72 paper recycling for the materials stated above. It is not the 73 intent of Legislature to have state dollars spent by public 74 school districts on recycling programs that cost more to 75 implement and operate than the amount recouped from the proceeds 76 of the sale of recycled materials. 77 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
