2	An act relating to the personal care attendant program;
3	amending s. 413.402, F.S.; revising provisions governing a
4	program to provide personal care attendants for persons
5	who have disabilities; requiring the Florida Endowment
6	Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to enter into an
7	agreement with the Florida Association of Centers for
8	Independent Living to administer a program to provide such
9	attendants to persons who have severe and chronic
10	disabilities; naming the program the "James Patrick
11	Memorial Work Incentive Personal Attendant Services
12	Program"; providing for payment for the administration of
13	the program; removing a provision requiring interagency
14	memoranda of agreement; revising eligibility requirements
15	for participation in the personal care attendant program;
16	removing provisions concerning the training, selection,
17	and recruitment of personal care attendants; providing for
18	training of program participants concerning hiring and
19	managing an attendant; providing for the adoption and
20	revision of program policies and procedures by the
21	association in cooperation with an oversight group;
22	providing for membership in the oversight group; amending
23	s. 413.4021, F.S.; increasing the percentage of revenues
24	collected from persons who fail to remit sales tax which
25	is deposited in the operating account of the Florida
26	Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to
27	administer the program; deleting a provision requiring
28	that the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational
29	Rehabilitation select an entity to administer the program;
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30	providing for automatic enrollment in the program for
31	certain persons; providing an effective date.
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33	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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35	Section 1. Section 413.402, Florida Statutes, is amended to
36	read:
37	413.402 Personal care attendant programThe Florida
38	Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation shall enter
39	into an agreement with the Florida Association of Centers for
40	Independent Living to administer the James Patrick Memorial Work
41	Incentive Personal Attendant Services, in conjunction with the
42	Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the Department of Health,
43	shall develop a Program to provide personal care attendants to
44	persons who have severe and chronic disabilities of all kinds and
45	who are eligible under pursuant to subsection (1). Effective July
46	1, 2008, the Florida Association of Centers for Independent
47	Living shall receive 15 percent of the funds to be deposited with
48	the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation
49	pursuant to ss. 320.08068(4)(d) and 413.4021(1) to administer the
50	program. association and the Department of Health shall jointly
51	develop memoranda of understanding with the Department of
52	Revenue, the Florida Medicaid program in the Agency for Health
53	Care Administration, the Florida Endowment Foundation for
54	Vocational Rehabilitation, and the Division of Vocational
55	Rehabilitation of the Department of Education.
56	(1) <u>In order to be</u> <del>Persons</del> eligible to participate in the
57	program <u>, a person</u> must:
58	(a) Be at least 18 years of age <u>, be a resident of this</u>

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59	state for at least 12 months immediately prior to application to
60	the program, and be significantly and chronically disabled due to
61	a traumatic spinal cord injury;
62	(b) Require a personal care attendant for <u>assistance with</u>
63	or support for at least two activities of daily living as defined
64	in s. 429.02, as determined by a physician or psychiatrist
65	bathing, dressing, bowel and bladder management, and
66	transportation;
67	(c) Require a personal care attendant <u>in order</u> to <u>accept a</u>
68	job or maintain substantial gainful employment; and
69	(d) Be able to <u>acquire</u> <del>hire</del> and <u>direct</u> <del>supervise</del> a personal
70	care attendant <u>.</u> ; and
71	(e) Meet one of the following requirements:
72	1. Live in a nursing home;
73	2. Have moved out of a nursing home within the preceding
74	180 days due to participation in a Medicaid home and community-
75	based waiver program targeted to persons with brain or spinal
76	cord injuries; or
77	3. Presently be employed but, because of a loss of a
78	caregiver, will lose employment and potentially return to a
79	nursing home.
80	(2)(a) The association, in cooperation with the Department
81	of Health and the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational
82	Rehabilitation, shall develop a program to recruit, screen, and
83	select candidates to be trained as personal care attendants.
84	(b) The services of a nurse registry licensed pursuant to
85	s. 400.506 may be utilized to recruit and screen candidates and
86	to operate as a fiscal intermediary through which payments are
87	made to individuals performing services as personal care

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88 attendants under the program. The Department of Health and the 89 Agency for Health Care Administration shall seek any federal 90 waivers necessary to implement this provision. (3) The Florida Association of Centers for Independent 91 92 Living association and the Department of Health, in cooperation 93 with the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational 94 Rehabilitation, shall provide develop a training to program participants on hiring and managing a personal care attendant 95 96 and, in cooperation with the oversight group described in 97 paragraph (b), adopt and revise the policies and procedures governing the personal care attendant program and the training 98 99 program. 100 The oversight group shall include, but need not be (b) 101 limited to, a member of the Florida Association of Centers for 102 Independent Living, a person who is participating in the program, 103 and one representative each from the Department of Revenue, the 104 Department of Children and Family Services, the Division of 105 Vocational Rehabilitation in the Department of Education, the 106 Medicaid program in the Agency for Health Care Administration, the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, 107 108 and the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the Department of 109 Health program for personal care attendants. 110

110 (4) The association, in cooperation with the Department of 111 Health and the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational 112 Rehabilitation, shall establish procedures for selecting persons 113 eligible under subsection (1) to participate in the program. 114 (5) The association, in cooperation with the Department of

115 Revenue, the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the 116 Department of Health, the Florida Medicaid program in the Agency

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117 for Health Care Administration, a representative from the state 118 attorney's office in each of the judicial circuits participating 119 in the program, the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational 120 Rehabilitation, and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of 121 the Department of Education, shall develop a plan for 122 implementation of the program.

123 (6) The Department of Health shall establish an oversight 124 workgroup for the personal care attendant program to oversee the 125 implementation and administration of the program. The workgroup 126 shall be composed of one representative from the Brain and Spinal 127 Cord Injury Program in the Department of Health, one 128 representative from the Department of Revenue, one representative 129 from the Florida Medicaid Program in the Agency for Health Care 130 Administration, one representative from the Florida Endowment 131 Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, one representative from 132 the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living, one 133 representative from the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of 1.34 the Department of Education, and two members who are persons with 135 traumatic spinal cord injuries or are family members of persons 136 with traumatic spinal cord injuries.

137 Section 2. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 413.4021,138 Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

139 413.4021 Program participant selection; tax collection 140 enforcement diversion program.--The Department of Revenue, in 141 coordination with the Florida Association of Centers for 142 Independent Living and the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys 143 Association, shall select judicial circuits in which to operate 144 the program. The association and the state attorneys' offices 145 shall develop and implement a tax collection enforcement

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diversion program, which shall collect revenue due from persons who have not remitted their collected sales tax. The criteria for referral to the tax collection enforcement diversion program shall be determined cooperatively between the state attorneys' offices and the Department of Revenue.

(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 212.20, 50 percent 151 152 of the revenues collected from the tax collection enforcement 153 diversion program shall be deposited into the operating account 154 of the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational 155 Rehabilitation, to be used to administer the personal care 156 attendant program and to contract with the state attorneys 157 participating in the tax collection enforcement diversion program 158 in an amount of not more than \$50,000 for each state attorney.

(2) The program shall operate only from funds deposited
into the operating account of the Florida Endowment Foundation
for Vocational Rehabilitation. The Florida Endowment Foundation
for Vocational Rehabilitation shall select the entity to
administer the personal care attendant program.

164 Section 3. Notwithstanding any other law, each person 165 enrolled in the personal care attendant program under s. 413.402, 166 Florida Statutes, on June 30, 2008, and each person enrolled in 167 the pilot personal care attendant program in Lake, Orange, 168 Osceola, and Seminole Counties as authorized in Specific 169 Appropriation 340, chapter 2006-25, Laws of Florida, on June 30, 170 2008, is automatically eligible for and enrolled in the personal care attendant program, as amended by this act on July 1, 2008. 171 172 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
