3	amending s. 413.402, F.S.; revising provisions governing a
4	program to provide personal care attendants for persons
5	who have disabilities; requiring the Florida Endowment
6	Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to enter into an
7	agreement with the Florida Association of Centers for
8	Independent Living to administer a program to provide such
9	attendants to persons who have severe and chronic
10	disabilities; naming the program the "James Patrick
11	Memorial Work Incentive Personal Attendant Services
12	Program"; providing for payment for the administration of
13	the program; removing a provision requiring interagency
14	memoranda of agreement; revising eligibility requirements
15	for participation in the personal care attendant program;
16	removing provisions concerning the training, selection,
17	and recruitment of personal care attendants; providing for
18	training of program participants concerning hiring and
19	managing an attendant; providing for the adoption and
20	revision of program policies and procedures by the
21	association in cooperation with an oversight group;
22	providing for membership in the oversight group; amending
23	s. 413.4021, F.S.; increasing the percentage of revenues
24	collected from persons who fail to remit sales tax which
25	is deposited in the operating account of the Florida
26	Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation to
27	administer the program; deleting a provision requiring
28	that the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational
29	Rehabilitation select an entity to administer the program;

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30	providing for automatic enrollment in the program for
31	certain persons; providing an effective date.
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33	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:
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35	Section 1. Section 413.402, Florida Statutes, is amended to
36	read:
37	413.402 Personal care attendant programThe Florida
38	Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation shall enter
39	into an agreement with the Florida Association of Centers for
40	Independent Living to administer the James Patrick Memorial Work
41	Incentive Personal Attendant Services, in conjunction with the
42	Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the Department of Health,
43	shall develop a Program to provide personal care attendants to
44	persons who have severe and chronic disabilities of all kinds and
45	who are eligible under pursuant to subsection (1). Effective July
46	1, 2008, the Florida Association of Centers for Independent
47	Living shall receive 15 percent of the funds to be deposited with
48	the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation
49	pursuant to ss. 320.08068(4)(d) and 413.4021(1) to administer the
50	program. association and the Department of Health shall jointly
51	develop memoranda of understanding with the Department of
52	Revenue, the Florida Medicaid program in the Agency for Health
53	Care Administration, the Florida Endowment Foundation for
54	Vocational Rehabilitation, and the Division of Vocational
55	Rehabilitation of the Department of Education.
56	(1) <u>In order to be</u> Persons eligible to participate in the
57	program <u>, a person</u> must:
58	(a) Be at least 18 years of age <u>, be a legal resident of</u>

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59	this state, and be significantly and chronically disabled due to
60	a traumatic spinal cord injury;
61	(b) Require a personal care attendant for <u>assistance with</u>
62	or support for at least two activities of daily living as defined
63	in s. 429.02, as determined by a physician or psychiatrist
64	bathing, dressing, bowel and bladder management, and
65	transportation;
66	(c) Require a personal care attendant <u>in order</u> to <u>accept a</u>
67	job or maintain substantial gainful employment; and
68	(d) Be able to <u>acquire</u> hire and <u>direct</u> supervise a personal
69	care attendant.; and
70	(e) Meet one of the following requirements:
71	1. Live in a nursing home;
72	2. Have moved out of a nursing home within the preceding
73	180 days due to participation in a Medicaid home and community-
74	based waiver program targeted to persons with brain or spinal
75	cord injuries; or
76	3. Presently be employed but, because of a loss of a
77	caregiver, will lose employment and potentially return to a
78	nursing home.
79	(2)(a) The association, in cooperation with the Department
80	of Health and the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational
81	Rehabilitation, shall develop a program to recruit, screen, and
82	select candidates to be trained as personal care attendants.
83	(b) The services of a nurse registry licensed pursuant to
84	s. 400.506 may be utilized to recruit and screen candidates and
85	to operate as a fiscal intermediary through which payments are
86	made to individuals performing services as personal care
87	attendants under the program. The Department of Health and the

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88 Agency for Health Care Administration shall seek any federal 89 waivers necessary to implement this provision. 90 (3) The Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living association and the Department of Health, in cooperation 91 with the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational 92 93 94 participants on hiring and managing a personal care attendant 95 and, in cooperation with the oversight group described in 96 paragraph (b), adopt and revise the policies and procedures 97 governing the personal care attendant program and the training 98 program. 99 (b) The oversight group shall include, but need not be

100 limited to, a member of the Florida Association of Centers for 101 Independent Living, a person who is participating in the program, and one representative each from the Department of Revenue, the 102 103 Department of Children and Family Services, the Division of 104 Vocational Rehabilitation in the Department of Education, the 105 Medicaid program in the Agency for Health Care Administration, 106 the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, 107 and the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the Department of 108 Health program for personal care attendants.

109 (4) The association, in cooperation with the Department of
 110 Health and the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational
 111 Rehabilitation, shall establish procedures for selecting persons
 112 eligible under subsection (1) to participate in the program.

113 (5) The association, in cooperation with the Department of 114 Revenue, the Brain and Spinal Cord Injury Program in the 115 Department of Health, the Florida Medicaid program in the Agency 116 for Health Care Administration, a representative from the state

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117 attorney's office in each of the judicial circuits participating 118 in the program, the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational 119 Rehabilitation, and the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of 120 the Department of Education, shall develop a plan for 121 implementation of the program.

122 (6) The Department of Health shall establish an oversight 123 workgroup for the personal care attendant program to oversee the implementation and administration of the program. The workgroup 124 shall be composed of one representative from the Brain and Spinal 125 126 Cord Injury Program in the Department of Health, one 127 representative from the Department of Revenue, one representative 128 from the Florida Medicaid Program in the Agency for Health Care 129 Administration, one representative from the Florida Endowment 130 Foundation for Vocational Rehabilitation, one representative from 131 the Florida Association of Centers for Independent Living, one 132 representative from the Division of Vocational Rehabilitation of 133 the Department of Education, and two members who are persons with 1.34 traumatic spinal cord injuries or are family members of persons 135 with traumatic spinal cord injuries.

Section 2. Subsections (1) and (2) of section 413.4021, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

138 413.4021 Program participant selection; tax collection 139 enforcement diversion program. -- The Department of Revenue, in 140 coordination with the Florida Association of Centers for 141 Independent Living and the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys 142 Association, shall select judicial circuits in which to operate 143 the program. The association and the state attorneys' offices 144 shall develop and implement a tax collection enforcement 145 diversion program, which shall collect revenue due from persons

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146 who have not remitted their collected sales tax. The criteria for 147 referral to the tax collection enforcement diversion program 148 shall be determined cooperatively between the state attorneys' 149 offices and the Department of Revenue.

(1) Notwithstanding the provisions of s. 212.20, 50 percent 150 151 of the revenues collected from the tax collection enforcement 152 diversion program shall be deposited into the operating account 153 of the Florida Endowment Foundation for Vocational 154 Rehabilitation, to be used to administer the personal care 155 attendant program and to contract with the state attorneys 156 participating in the tax collection enforcement diversion program 157 in an amount of not more than \$50,000 for each state attorney.

158 (2) The program shall operate only from funds deposited
159 into the operating account of the Florida Endowment Foundation
160 for Vocational Rehabilitation. The Florida Endowment Foundation
161 for Vocational Rehabilitation shall select the entity to
162 administer the personal care attendant program.

163 Section 3. Notwithstanding any other law, each person 164 enrolled in the personal care attendant program under s. 413.402, Florida Statutes, on June 30, 2008, and each person enrolled in 165 166 the pilot personal care attendant program in Lake, Orange, 167 Osceola, and Seminole Counties as authorized in Specific Appropriation 340, chapter 2006-25, Laws of Florida, on June 30, 168 169 2008, is automatically eligible for and enrolled in the personal 170 care attendant program, as amended by this act on July 1, 2008. 171 Section 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.

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
