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A bill to be entitled

An act relating to urban revitalization; creating s. 288.715, F.S.; creating the Urban Revitalization Congress within the Executive Office of the Governor; providing legislative intent; providing for membership, staff support, and reimbursement for travel and per diem expenses for members; providing tasks; providing an appropriation; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Section 288.715, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

- 288.715 Urban Revitalization Congress.--
- (1)LEGISLATIVE INTENT. -- The Legislature finds and declares:
- (a) Fiscally strong urban centers are beneficial to regional and state economies and a resource for minimizing future urban distress and should, therefore, be promoted by state and local governments.
- (b) The health and vibrancy of an urban center benefits its region and state; conversely, the deterioration of an urban core negatively affects the surrounding area and the entire state.
- (c) In recognition of the interwoven destiny between urban centers, the surrounding suburbs, the region, and the state, the respective governments are encouraged to establish a framework for working in partnership with communities and the private sector to revitalize urban centers.
 - State urban policies should guide the state, regional (d)

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agencies, local governments, and the private sector in preserving and revitalizing existing urban centers and promoting the adequate provision of infrastructure, human services, safe neighborhoods, educational facilities, and economic development needed to sustain these centers into the future.

- (e) Successfully revitalizing and sustaining urban centers is dependent on addressing, through an integrated and coordinated statewide and community effort, the varied cultural, educational, recreational, economic, transportation, and social service components essential to maintaining a healthy urban environment.
- (f) Leadership, strategic guidance, resource coordination and leveraging, and promoting the use of innovative approaches are recognized as essential factors for promoting and sustaining urban centers. State and regional agencies and local governments must provide incentives to promote urban revitalization, which along with existing programs, need to be integrated to the maximum extent possible to promote urban revitalization and to achieve the goals of the state's urban policy.
- (2) ESTABLISHMENT.--There is established, as part of an overall state urban strategy, the Urban Revitalization Congress within the Executive Office of the Governor to foster leadership and provide resources and support to economically energize the state's urban centers.
 - (3) MEMBERSHIP.--
- The congress shall consist of members appointed (a) by the Governor, one of whom the Governor shall appoint as chair. The members shall include both elected and appointed local government officials, directors of urban centers, representatives of economic and community development organizations,

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private-sector leaders, as well as other parties having an interest in and knowledge about the vitality of this state's urban centers.

- Members shall serve without compensation but are (b) entitled to receive per diem and travel expenses in accordance with s. 112.061 while performing their duties.
 - (c) The congress shall meet at least twice per year.
 - TASKS.--At a minimum, the congress shall:
- (a) Award competitive grants to fund demonstration projects that encourage business investment in urban centers.
- (b) Provide matching funds for community redevelopment projects and partnerships with urban colleges and universities which support urban revitalization programs.
- (c) Work with state agencies and communities to prepare a statewide strategy and plan for revitalizing and sustaining the state's urban centers.
- (5) STAFFING. -- The Executive Office of the Governor shall provide staff support for the congress.
- (6) REPORTS. -- The congress shall prepare an annual report, which shall be submitted to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives beginning September 1, 2009, and annually thereafter.
- (7) TERMINATION. -- The congress shall expire July 1, 2012. Section 2. The sum of \$ is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to the Executive Office of the Governor for the purpose of funding the activities of the Urban Revitalization Congress during the 2008-2009 fiscal year.
 - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
